Pastor's Page

Our scripture readings on this Fifth Sunday of Easter start off with the Acts of the Apostles chapter 9. This is after Paul's conversion on the way to Damascus. This part of the chapter focuses on Paul in the immediate aftermath of his conversion experience. He goes from extreme persecutor of Christians to a preacher to the Jews at Damascus.

Luke stresses everyone's amazement at the turnabout. In response to Paul's aggressive witness and arguing that Jesus is the Son of God and the Messiah, the Jews naturally plot against him. Luke reminds his readers how the Jerusalem Christians realistically feared Paul at first, thinking it was some kind of trick, not believing he was one of them. Barnabas however becomes the link between Paul and the Twelve.

Barnabas first appears in Acts 4:36. "There was a certain Levite from Cyprus named Joseph, to whom the Apostles gave the name Barnabas (meaning son of encouragement). He sold a farm that he owned and made a donation of the money, laying it at the Apostle's feet.) He had submitted to the authority of the Apostles.

Barnabas introduces Paul to the Apostles and explains Paul's call and his witness to Jesus in Damascus. The addition of Paul will be a great benefit for the growing Church.

John's gospel has as one of its main purposes the strong attempt to present an understanding of Jesus as the divine Son of God. The truths and teachings presented in John's gospel are more deeply theological and reflective than the way the truths are presented in the other three Gospels (which are called the Synoptic Gospels – meaning to be seen together).

The prayerful nature of John's Gospel and its familiar and treasured imagery of Jesus as "the bread of life", the "light of the world" and the "Good Shepherd", have made this Gospel a source for the meditation on the divine significance of Jesus' life.

John's Gospel does not have the rapid fire, one after another miracle stories and lists of short sayings that characterize much of the Synoptic Gospels. Rather John offers long, unified stories and discourses, which are extended presentations by Jesus. Such as discourses on the Bread of Life (John 6:22-59) and the Last Supper Discourse (John 14:1-21).

We also see allegory in John's gospel when used to talk about the Good Shepherd

(10:1-18) and the Branches like we see today. This comes from the Old Testament allegory of Israel as God's true vine. Jesus personalizes this. He himself is the true vine.

The Father takes personal care of this vine, pruning the barren branches and trimming clear the fruitful branches. The central teaching of the allegory is clear. We are part of this vine, Jesus is the vine. We become fruitful when we remain in Jesus' love. If this happens, when this happens, the disciple will produce fruit.

This is a huge vine. There are many, many branches throughout the world. Let us pray that as Christ is the vine and we are the branches our prayer will be that each of the branches and will grow stronger on the vine.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
