BAPTISM - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month at 12:30PM Next dates: March 4th & 18th, April 1st & 15th

PRE-JORDAN - instruction/sacramental preparation for parents is held in the Sacred Heart Chapel every other month – January, March, May, July, September and November. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Denise Schmidt 215-483-1000 between the hours of 9AM to 4PM to register. The next date for Pre-Jordan class is March 20th at 7PM in Church due to Lenten Mass in Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM.

MARRIAGE - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). The **Spring** date is **April 21**st. Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 to register for Pre-Cana.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation). Pastor's Page

As Jesus is transfigured before his disciples in today's Gospel from Mark, a voice comes from the cloud saying: "This is my beloved Son, Listen to Him." Lent is a special time to listen even more closely to Jesus. Last week we heard him proclaim, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

In the first reading, the faith of Abraham is tested in a most extreme way. So too will the faith of the disciples be tested during the time leading up to Jesus' death and resurrection. We know what awaits us at the end of Lent, but the disciples in real time did not and their faith wavered. As St. Paul tells the Romans, the resurrection of Christ demonstrated once and for all that God has the power to snatch victory from defeat and bring life out of death.

Strong in faith or weak in faith, God has a special place for all. Abraham was strong in faith right from the beginning. "Go to a land that I will show you". It took a great deal of faith to do that. As a good Lenten story, read the saga of Abraham in Genesis chapters 12 to 25. Abraham was the very model of trust in God. He obeyed God even in extreme circumstances. He was willing to sacrifice his own son if this is what God was asking.

In the Gospel, Jesus is transfigured and appears in glory with Elijah and Moses. This happens with the inner circle of disciples, Peter, James and John. In Mark's version, they are terrified and later confused. At this point, Peter is unable to understand or accept what Jesus revels to him. In contrast to Abraham, Peter's faith is often weak. Yet Jesus chooses Peter to lead the church.

St. Paul gives us a very good pep talk today in the epistle to the Romans. Paul asks, "If God is for us, who is against us?" The question is really a statement. Paul is saying, "If God is for us, then it does not ultimately matter who is against us." God gave up Jesus, the eternal Son, for us all. Nothing can separate us from this love of God, claims Paul. At the end of this chapter, it is as if Paul names everything he can think of that might separate us from God (Romans 8:35-39). The worst that can happen to us cannot separate us from the love us God. Not trial, not distress, not persecution, not hunger, not nakedness not danger, not the sword.

Nowhere, not in Romans nor anywhere else in the Bible, are we promised freedom from suffering. Some illnesses will not be healed, some mistakes will not be erased, some pain will never go away. Faith in God does not insulate us from the rest of humanity with its struggles, its disappointments and it's losses.

Faith in God is relational, not circumstantial. We trust in God's unconditional love. People of faith in all ages have found that the assurance of God's love has sufficed for every need. Trusting in God's unfailing love can strengthen us in our ordeals, encourage us in grief and loss and inspire us to live in hope. Secure in God's love, no threat need overpower us, no danger defeat us. The good news of the gospel is this: If God is for us, it matters little who is against us. If God is for us, all will be well.

Parish Resources

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid

Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
