**BAPTISM** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month at 12:30PM Next dates: **Aug.** 5<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup>, **Sept.** 2<sup>nd</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup>

**PRE-JORDAN** - instruction/sacramental preparation for parents is held in the Sacred Heart Chapel every other month – January, March, May, July, September and November. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Denise Schmidt 215-483-1000 between the hours of 9AM to 4PM to register. The next date for Pre-Jordan class in September at 7PM in the Chapel is to be determined. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM.

**MARRIAGE** - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). The Fall date is to be determined. Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 to register for Pre-Cana.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation). ## Pastor's Page

Today we go away from the Year B readings from the Gospel of Mark. This Sunday and for the next four weeks we will hear from John's Gospel chapter 6 which deals specifically with the Eucharist. It is almost like a mini mid-summer retreat where we can come aside and rest awhile and as Mark's gospel stated last week, "he began to teach them many things."

The feeding miracle which we hear today is the only one of Jesus' miracles that are mentioned in all four gospels. Five barley loaves and a few fish became a banquet for multitudes. Jesus used the natural elements that were already there to fashion this miracle. Jesus provides abundance from a meager amount.

Jesus also does not perform this "sign" unilaterally. John's Gospel uses the term "sign" rather than "miracle." Jesus utilizes the food of one of the crowd's little and lowly ones, a boy. The boy generously gives of his own bread, putting it in the hands of Jesus for others. Having money would not have solved this problem either. As Phillip said, "two hundred days wages would not be enough for each of them to have a little" Jesus also asks his disciples to join in his work of providing for others.

In the parallel Old Testament reading today, Elisha is the prophet who has succeeded Elijah. Elisha becomes known for his healing powers. In one incident he cures Naaman, a commander in the Syrian army of leprosy. Elisha is presented twenty barley loaves as an offering for himself and the priests. Elisha is able to affect a miraculous increase in the bread so that a hundred hungry people are fed. This shows a deep concern for the people.

St. John Chrysostom, who lived in the last half of the fourth century, raised an interesting question in connection with the gospel story today. Why didn't Jesus simply create food out of thin air rather than multiply the food that was there. This was pretty common food. Could not Jesus have come up with something more exciting? St. John Chrysostom answers his own question saying it was because Jesus wanted to use "the creation itself as a groundwork for his marvels" Rather than create something anew, Jesus takes what is already at hand and transforms it by multiplying it. In doing this Jesus teaches us two things.

First, he is teaching us that creation is already miraculous. The ongoing existence of the world is already a miraculous act. The miracles of Jesus reinforce this truth, not undercut it. Secondly, Jesus takes what is already at hand and transforms it. In Jesus' hands a little bit goes a very long way. In fact, there is an abundance.

Let us also not overlook the fact that when Jesus takes the loaves, he gave thanks. The Greek word Eucharist means "to give thanks". The ultimate sign of this miracle is going to point to Jesus as the bread of life, as we are going to see in the subsequent reading of John's Chapter 6.

### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ **CONFIRMATION**

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
