CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, May 15 @ 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

Easter is so much more than just one day that we celebrate each year. Liturgically and spiritually we celebrate Easter for seven weeks. We do this as a believing Christian community because we need all this time to appreciate all the new things that God is doing in our lives. On this Second Sunday of Easter, which the Church has also designated as the Sunday of Divine Mercy, we focus on the early church and how those first disciples received and spread the Good News of God's merciful love.

Throughout Easter time of the Cycle A readings, we read from the First Letter of Saint Peter. This work is an ancient baptismal catechesis or teaching. Today's selection echoes the Acts of the Apostles, reminding believers of their call: "a new birth to a living hope...to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled and unfading (1 Peter1:3-4) The passage anticipates todays Gospel of Thomas' doubting and believing.

A major theme during Easter is our Baptism. Notice how the letter intimately connects our rebirth through Baptism to the Resurrection of Jesus. Christian rebirth from water and Spirit is a birth to hope.

Also during the Easter Season we will hear extensively from the Acts of the Apostles in the first reading. This takes the place of the Old Testament reading. The Acts of the Apostles is the second part of the Gospel of Luke, the first part being his gospel. The Acts of the Apostles is sometimes called "The Gospel of the Holy Spirit". Roughly the first half of the book focuses on the life of the first Christian community living in Jerusalem – the works of the various Apostles and disciples there, leading up to the conversion of Paul. We later see how the Apostles explain or better yet proclaim their experience of Jesus to various audiences.

Acts portrays the young community's inner life as the fount from which it's public witness springs, the foundation upon which it's witness stands. That community's four identifying marks brand us still: the teaching of the Apostles, to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers. (Acts 2:42)

In today's Gospel we have the famous story of the "doubting Thomas". His stance is one of extreme incredulity or unbelief. This is in opposition to some of the other characters in the Resurrection story of the gospel so far. For example, the Beloved disciple when arriving at the tomb sees the burial cloths and head wrapping. Peter is perplexed, but the response of the Beloved Disciple is one of faith: "He saw and believed" (verse 8). Thomas will not believe unless he sees and touches. And so Jesus invites him to faith through sight and touch. Thomas was placed in a position in which unbelief became impossible.

Verse 28 is very important to note: "My Lord and My God". John intends this powerful phrasing as a cornerstone of the Christian profession of faith. To all who will read or hear this story, the lesson is: "Do not be unbelieving, but believe". We give thanks to the Lord for this gift of faith, especially when we gather for the breaking of the bread and the prayers.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
