CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u></u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, May 9, 2022 at 7 pm in the Chapel.**</u>

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

As we move deeper now into our Lenten journey, Isaiah in the first reading gives us a message of hope. Isaiah was preaching to the exiles in Babylon who were reflecting back on all the miraculous deeds that the Lord had done for them bringing them out of Egypt. He recognizes they are in bad straits. But he tells them, 'remember not the events of the past...see I am doing something new." This is a wonderful passage of scripture because it shows us we can leave our past behind. God's offer of grace is the promise of a second chance and a clean slate. He does "new things" when we welcome him into our hearts. God is doing something new right here and now!

In St. Paul's epistle to the Philippians, he teaches us that the grace of God is more than the offer of a pardon of our sins. It is the restoration of a right relationship to God. The power flowing from the Resurrection of Christ not only frees us from our sins, it empowers us to live a new life. This is truly transformative for us.

The woman in the Gospel story today from the 8th Chapter of John was in a terrible circumstance. And more than the sin, it was a capital crime that carried the death penalty. She was to be stoned to death. The punishment it would seem to us today would be far too harsh for the crime. Occasionally we read that some Islamic republic has beheaded those guilty of adultery. This does not even consider the point of what happened to the man that she committed adultery with. Some may consider that such measures may produce a more orderly society.

Jesus did not even threaten her, let alone punish her. He simply said, ""Neither do I condemn you. But from now on, avoid this sin." She left there that day with a second chance. It was purely a matter of grace. She did not earn any of it. What could be more wonderful than that? Yet evidence suggests that sometimes we are troubled by it. It is too good to be true?

Consider the number of people given new life in today's readings. Isaiah tells of God putting water in the desert to give life to the Israelites who fled Egypt and later those who were in exile in Babylon. Paul was given life in Christ when he encountered Jesus on the road to Damascus. The woman in the Gospel is given life by Jesus when he challenges the scribes and the Pharisees, then releases her. New life is promised to us as well, life lived in the light of Christ.

If our God was a vengeful God, who could survive? We are sinful creatures, struggling to do good in God's eyes but often coming up short. Even now, during this penitential season, we need to seek God's mercy. Fortunately, our God is a merciful God, always ready to forgive us. As we celebrate as a believing, Christian community today, let us thank God for this overflowing mercy and consider those whom we ourselves need to forgive.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
