CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, May 15 @ 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

Each year the Fifty Days of Easter have a kind of shape or structure formed by the Sunday scriptures. The second and third Sundays offer encounters with the risen Christ. The Fourth always brings us into the arms of the Good Shepherd. The Gospels of the fifth, sixth and seventh Sundays are drawn from Jesus 'farewell discourse' in John's Gospel.

In our first reading today, Peter has clearly taken on the role of shepherd, encouraging conversion and faith among his listeners. That the crowd addressed their question to "Peter and the other apostles" indicates Peter was speaking for them all, as the Pope often speaks for the college of bishops today. The crowds are told to repent and are baptized. Acts 2:41 mentions the number three thousand to show that a substantial portion of the Jewish people did believe in their Messiah and thus continued as the people of God's promises.

This section also indicates that salvation has both an individual and a communal dimension. Each person has to accept his or her salvation, but this is not merely a private matter between the individual and Jesus. One is baptized into God's people and saved as a member of the Church.

The First Letter of Saint Peter echoes Acts: Christ "bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness" and anticipates the gospel: "For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd."

In this passage we see the metaphor of Jesus not only as the shepherd but also as the gate. It is he who provides safety for the flock by prohibiting entrance to marauders and who provides food by opening out onto good pasture lands. Jesus will effect all this because he himself is the Good Shepherd, loved by the Father because he will lay down his life for the sheep. It is this act of total loving self-sacrifice that is central to the story. He is the Good Shepherd because of his willing self-sacrifice.

Through Jesus we come in to be nurtured within the community and go out to bear witness in conviction and compassionate service. Jesus has come not only to guide and protect the sheep, but to make sure we flourish. "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). Sadly the gospel notes that "the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them. (10:6) We sometimes struggle ourselves to distinguish the voice of the Good Shepherd from among all the voices we hear in our lives, from our friends and neighbors to those on television or online. Let us become attuned to Jesus voice and pray for the grace to recognize what he is calling us to be.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
