CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is September 3 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Fall date to be announced.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

In our Old Testament reading today we hear one of the many events in the life of Elijah, considered to be Israel's greatest prophet. The people in Israel were not getting leadership from the Kings, with each one worse than the previous one. It had been a downward spiral from the high point of David and Solomon's reign. Who could speak of God to them? The answer would be Prophets.

Among the Israelites they alone had no interest in power, money or any approval but God's. Their mission was to "speak out" and lead the people back to observance of the covenant. Prophesying is often seen as a kind of crystal ball gazing that foresees the future, but the prophets of Israel based their oracles on the will of God. When the kings became obsessed with power and wealth and led their people into idolatry, God called upon certain individuals to warn Israel of the consequences and those individuals were the prophets. The period of Elijah and Elisha was approximately from 874 BC to 796 BC.

Leading into today's passage, Elijah has successfully defeated the prophets of Baal, one of the false Gods that the King Ahab and his wife Jezebel were leading the people to worship. This infuriates Jezebel and Elijah has to flee for his life. In this passage, Elijah feels he has failed, and he needs the strength of God's presence. God then sends Elijah food for his journey. At this point in his journey Elijah needed the bread only God could provide. The Lord sustained Elijah on his journey into the desert, providing food and water when he was ready to give up. The bread that the angel brought Elijah sustained him on a forty day journey through the desert to Mt. Horeb, a place where he would encounter God.

I would suggest for your summer reading this week the First Book of Kings Chapters 17-18-19. It is a fascinating story of Elijah as the successful leader in the struggle to preserve the knowledge and worship of Yahweh against the idol worship introduced by Jezebel, wife of King Ahab.

This feeding of Elijah that only God could provide leads us into our Gospel reading from John. This is the 3rd of 5 installments over 5 weeks that we consider Jesus as the bread of life. We can center in on verse 51 today: "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever."

The Bread of Life discourse in John's Gospel presents Jesus as the life giving bread who has come down from heaven. The Jewish leadership questions Jesus' origin: "How can he say, I have come down from heaven?" We as the readers of John's Gospel know the answer to this already previously in the Gospel.

"In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God" vs. 1 Also we hear in verse 14: "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us".

The first reading on Sunday usually gives us a guide to understand the Gospel that we will hear. As we listen to Jesus proclaim that he is "the living bread that came down from heaven", the plight of Elijah helps us see that God has sent us Christ himself as food for our journey, living out our mission as Christians.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
