CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is September 3 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

All three of today's Scripture readings talk about a meal and direct the reader/listener to the way of true life. In the first nine chapters of the book of Proverbs, Wisdom is personified as a woman who goes into the streets to invite all to seek her. In today's first reading, she has built a house and invites those who lack understanding to join in a sumptuous banquet. The dinner guest is to forsake foolishness, the opposite of Wisdom, so as to live. In Proverbs, true living consists of fearing and worshipping God, which leads to wealth, family and good reputation.

The Gospel today begins by repeating last Sunday's final verse, verse 51. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world".

Like the Wisdom woman in the first reading, Jesus offers an invitation to fullness of life. But his invitation today is met with skepticism and misunderstanding. Jesus makes a remarkable statement in today's passage from John: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life" (John 6:54).

In the Old Testament, "wisdom" refers not simply to intellectual attainment – the acquiring of knowledge – but to a life lived in accord with God's will for human beings. The figure of "Lady Wisdom" depicts this sort of life as supremely attractive and supremely rewarding. Here she offers a rich banquet to those who would answer her invitation. To share in the feast of Lady Wisdom is to learn how to live wisely. We find the same idea reflected in the Letter to the Ephesians who are exhorted to live "not as foolish persons but as wise".

For Christians, the Eucharist is Wisdom's feast, where we learn to forsake the foolishness of trying to live without God. We listen to God's wisdom proclaimed in scripture, and then we receive as food the flesh and blood of God's Word, Jesus, so that we may grow in understanding and wisdom.

In thinking about the Eucharist as Wisdom's feast, we must remember that wisdom is not the same thing as information. Today we have lots of information, but perhaps not so much wisdom. In the Eucharist, we do not acquire new information about God, but we draw the reality of God within ourselves – communion - so that we might begin to live in a new way – that way of living that Jesus calls "eternal life".

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
