CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month at 12:30PM
Next dates: **Contact the Rectory**

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is to be determined.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

Marriage - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance. IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There will be no Fall date due to the pandemic.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Pastor's Page

“Bring them here to me”, Jesus says to his disciples when they tell him they have five loaves and two fish. The food was hardly enough for just the disciples, let alone a crowd of thousands.

One's perspective influences the possibilities one sees in any given moment. For a person who operates from the basis of scarcity, the cup is always half empty. For the person who operates from a sense of abundance, the cup is half full. The disciples and most of the crowd on the hillside that day around Jesus must have been operating out of a sense of scarcity. They had done the math and the math did not add up. Over 5,000 people. No grocery stores no markets in sight. The disciples knew that there were going to be some very unhappy people who were going to be very hungry.

The disciples then asked Jesus to do the prudent thing, the common sense thing – send the crowd away to fend for themselves. Logic and common sense would have to prevail, unless you believe in the possibilities of abundance like Jesus did. The disciples saw a great crowd and they did not see any food. All they could see was a lack of resources. Jesus however saw much more in this moment.

Jesus knew a heavenly Father who showered abundance on his children out of pure love for them. God provided a miraculous abundance to the Chosen People in the desert. Multiplied across time, God has provided again and again. This story reveals that Jesus is as powerful and as loving as the God of the Exodus in chapter 16 who provided manna for his wandering people in the desert. Jesus is also portrayed as a David-like shepherd who leads his flock to lie down on green grass as He spreads the table of the Messiah's banquet before them.

What happened next is pure mystery. We do not know how the loaves and fishes multiplied. Maybe they miraculously doubled each time someone took some out of the baskets. Maybe people were moved by the example of the boy to share some of the loaves and fishes that they had been hiding out of the same sense of scarcity that had gripped the disciples. Either way it was a miracle. Hearts were challenged and changed.

This is a wonderful story of God's extravagant love. Jesus fed five thousand people with a mere five loaves and a couple of fish. But that's not the bottom line of the story. The punch line is that they gathered up twelve fragments after the meal! How fortunate we are that Jesus is here with us whenever we gather in his name. He nourishes us at this table, strengthening our weaknesses and fortifying us for our own journey. Let us pray today that we may all eat and be satisfied at this Eucharist.

In the Chapel the weeks are: **August 30, September 13 & 27, All of October is available, November 15 & 29, December 13, & 27.**

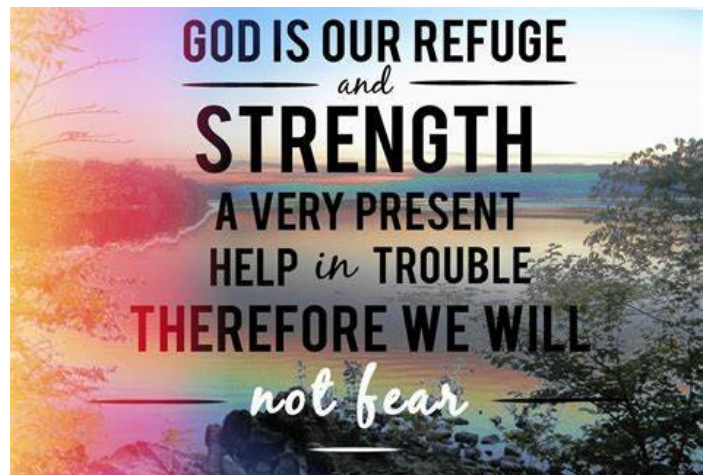

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
