CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, September 12 at 7PM in the Chapel.

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

Over the last several weeks we have heard parables about the Kingdom. Today we hear about requirements about entrance into that kingdom. The time is shortening, and once the door is locked it will not be reopened. We are called to make an informed and committed decision to undertake the journey to Jerusalem with Jesus, a journey that will end in suffering and death.

In the passage today, Luke reminds us that Jesus is still on the journey to Jerusalem according to God's plan. The question that is asked, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" offers Him the opportunity to mention once again the difficulties involved in following him. Jesus gives a nuanced answer to this question.

He specifically mentions those who are under the illusion that they were following Jesus, but maintained only a loose relationship with him, devoid of any real commitment. They ate and drank with him, but with no intimate fellowship. They heard his teaching, but did not accept it as the Word of God to be put into practice. The answer is very stern and foreboding: "I do not know where you are from. Depart from me....There will be wailing and grinding of teeth when you see Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the Kingdom of God, and you yourselves cast out."

No one is to be excluded from the Kingdom, however no ethnic or religious group possessed exclusive right to the Kingdom. Claiming to accompany Jesus does not equate to true discipleship. The Gentiles ("people from the east and the west and the north and the south") would receive a seat at the table formerly only available to the Jews. They are the last who will be the first.

God had already proclaimed this idea through the prophet Isaiah, "I come to gather nations of every language... distant coastlands that have never heard my fame or seen my glory...all your brothers and sisters from all the nations."

Jesus says, "Strive to enter through the narrow door". The narrow door does not mean that only a few are offered entrance but only that the narrow entrance must be chosen. Presumption plays a part in the people who want to gain entrance because of who they are, and not because of how they have lived their lives.

Anyone from any corner of the earth can walk the path to the narrow door. God's path is intended for all people, including those who we may consider "last". The way of God's goodness leads to a narrow door. Do we give "lip service" or "life service" to following Jesus and living the Kingdom of God? Do our actions conform to our words? As Jesus points out today, saying that "we ate and drank in your company" is not enough. Let us continue to follow Jesus to the narrow door.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL SCHOOL AND CHURCH VOLUNTEERS

All volunteers of our IHM School and Church must meet all Safe Environment requirements mandated by the State of Pennsylvania and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This includes all school volunteers and parish volunteers i.e. Lectors, EM, Choir Members, etc.

A list of all requirements are on the school website: iheartmary.org Go to Resources then to Volunteer and all the links are posted there. These clearances are FREE for volunteers.

These requirements are MANDATORY and there will be no exceptions. These must be completed or you may not volunteer in our school for any trips, dances or in house activities or any parish ministries.

The date we have for the Protecting God's Children Class here at IHM is Tuesday, September 27 @ 6:30pm. There are many choices for other nights at other locations. Go to virtusonline.org then first time registrant then to list of sessions to find one that is convenient for you to attend. There are classes available also through zoom.

It is best to get these completed before school begins. All clearances must be completed by November 1st in order for you to volunteer for the 2022-2023 school year.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
