CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is September 3 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

This Sunday we have the last installment of readings from John's Gospel, Chapter 6, centering on the Eucharist. The theme for this week will highlight the necessity of commitment. We are called to respond to Jesus' invitation to join him and make a commitment to following him.

The first reading from the Old Testament today sees Joshua, the successor to Moses giving a speech to the Hebrews after they have been established in the Promised Land. Joshua in this scene is preparing to die. He begs his people never to forget the one God who has done so much for them, and he warns them of the consequences if they do forget. The Israelites renew the covenant at a place called Shechem.

Joshua calls on the Chosen People to make a decision, to commit themselves or to recommit. It is taken for granted that they will serve some god. Joshua announces his own decision: He and his household will serve the Lord. All the rest of the men in authority over Israel wholeheartedly agree. They decide based on their experience with the Lord who freed them from Egyptian slavery, performed wonders and protected them. We too, need to experience God in some way if we are to serve him. A commitment of deeds as well as words is important. We too, need to experience God in some way if we are to serve him.

Each person has to decide what his way of life will be. Joshua asks the Israelites which God they will serve. Jesus asks the disciples if they too, will go away. God often asks hard things of us. It is better to endure difficulties, even crushing ones, with the Lord, than to enjoy the fleeting happiness of a life without Jesus. Those who are close to the Lord retain a peace and joy even while suffering. We also understand God's promise to deliver us in light of Christ and our own resurrection.

In today's passage from John chapter 6, Jesus talks about "flesh" and "spirit". The truth about the Eucharist that Our Lord reveals is not a natural truth that reason can grasp (like honor your father and mother), but a supernatural truth that can only be known if it is revealed. In addition, we need the grace of Christ to assent or to give our belief to it. In the case of the faithful apostles, this grace seems to come from their personal encounter with Jesus. They trusted our Lord, so they could believe the words he spoke.

In his Encyclical, *Evangelii Gaudium*, "The Joy of the Gospel", Pope Francis wrote: "I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, or at least an openness to letting him encounter them; I ask all of you to do this unfailingly each day". Pope Francis is certainly echoing Joshua to make a commitment and it begins with personally opening ourselves up and encountering Jesus.

We can encounter Christ in many ways if we are looking for him. Let Peter's response be ours: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
