CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is September 3 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

This Sunday we continue the Gospel readings from John's 6th Chapter. It is in this chapter that we see very clearly the teaching that Jesus is the Bread of Life.

We are nourished each Sunday when we come to Mass. We are nourished by the Word of God and we are nourished by the Eucharistic Meal. In the Gospel, Jesus reveals himself to be the Bread of Life, the source of everlasting sustenance.

The Gospel of John uses different styles of speech than those found in the synoptic Gospels. A distinctive feature of John's Gospel is the use of what are called the "I AM" sayings. These sayings are somewhat like similes in that they compare Jesus to another reality. Recall that the name for God in the Old Testament revered by the Hebrews was Yahweh and that the translation of the name is "I Am Who Am". This is the very definition of the verb to be. It is existence in itself.

In John's gospel, Jesus often begins his teachings with the words, "I am". Scholars tell us that John intended for such references to show a direct relationship between Jesus and Yahweh. That is, the "I am" sayings signal Jesus' divinity as the Son of God. This is something we take for granted as a matter of faith of course.

There are seven "I am" sayings that appear in the Gospel of John. Notice the number seven is probably significant. The number seven in the bible denotes something that is finished or complete. The Seven Sacraments would be an example. A listing of the I am statements:

- · I am the Bread of Life (6:35-40)
- · I am the Light of the World (8:12)
- · I am the Gate (10:7-10)
- · I am the Good Shepherd (10:11-18)
- · I am the Resurrection and the Life (11:17-27)
- · I am the Way and the Truth and the Life (14:1-7)
- · I am the True Vine (15:1-11)

This section of John's gospel is an introduction to the longer discourse or speech later in chapter six. The crowd that had been satisfied with the miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fishes goes in search of Jesus. Jesus warns them not to seek food that perishes. They are to seek the food that will last into eternal life. Jesus himself is that bread. We need to seek that food that will endure for eternal life.

I would suggest that you read the entire Chapter 6 of John's Gospel sometime during this month to prepare to hear the Word proclaimed during the Eucharistic Liturgy.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
