### CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

**Baptism** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, September 18 @ 7pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

**<u>RCIA</u>** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. ## Pastor's Page

It is unusual when the Ordinary Sunday is surpassed in the liturgical order of celebration by a Feast but the Transfiguration is one of those Feasts. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration remembering the day when Jesus was transfigured before the eyes of his closest disciples. On that day, our Lord's glory shown through him like the sun, his whole being shining with light. We recall that on the first day of creation, God transformed the world with light. Today we join Peter, James and John on the holy mountain, where Jesus who dwells within us, transforms every darkness in our lives.

The Transfiguration is one of the important events that is detailed in each of the Synoptic Gospels (Mark, Luke, Matthew). There are elements that are common to each of the Gospels but also some differences. These are the elements that are common to all three: Jesus takes Peter, James and John up onto a mountain. While there Jesus is transformed in some manner and his clothes become gleaming white. The three disciples see Moses and Elijah talking to Jesus. Peter speaks up and suggests three booths be built, one for each of Jesus, Moses and Elijah. Then a cloud overshadows the group. The voice of God emanates from the cloud, proclaiming that Jesus is his son. "Listen to him" it bellows. Then Moses and Elijah disappear.

The core message of the text is that Jesus is a true prophet like Moses or Elijah yet as the Son of God, he is superior to them and his words carry even more weight. Today we hear Matthew's account. We see an act of reverence by the disciples. They fall on their faces, filled with awe. Then another detail unique to Matthew. Jesus approaches them and touches them saying, "Rise, and have no fear" (17:7) Only Matthew notes Jesus "face shown like the sun". For Matthew it seems his intent is to highlight Jesus identify, especially as the new Moses. Related to this we also see the harmonization of the voice from the cloud at the transfiguration with the voice from heaven at Jesus' Baptism.

We need to realize the Transfiguration is a preview of the Resurrection story. For example, Christ's shining garments are similar to the "dazzling clothing" worn by the angels standing outside the tomb. Despite these parallels it should be noted that the resurrected Jesus does not look like the transfigured Christ (he is mistaken for the gardener for example.)

The Transfiguration stands as a confirmation of Christ's status as prophet, messiah and Son of God. It is a revelation that the Kingdom of God has in some sense, arrived. It looks back to Peter's Confession and to the Lord's double prediction of his own Passion and his Disciples persecution. But it also looks forward to the resurrection of Christ and the glorification of the saints. The entire episode is built atop a mound of allusions to the Old Testament – especially to the ministry of Moses.

Our world has always been in need of transformation, and these days that need seems to be great. Jesus gives us that first step. Let us be as Peter says, a lamp shining in a dark place", shining the light of God into those dark spaces of our lives.



### PREP REGISTRATION FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Registration for PREP (the Religious Education Program) at IHM Parish is now open for grades one through seven.

Classes will begin on Tuesday, September 12, 2023. We will be meeting weekly from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm. Registration must be completed prior to the start date of classes.

### **Parish Resources**

#### <u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
