CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is to be announced. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

Advent is traditionally a time of recounting the first coming of Christ some two thousand years ago, when our God chose to dwell among us and ultimately to renew the face of the earth with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit fifty days after the Resurrection of Christ.

The relatively short season of Advent—is an opportunity to draw closer to God and to one another, to listen more readily to God's word in scripture and to partake more willingly in the sacred mysteries of our faith, most especially in the Eucharist as well as the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Perhaps for some it is a time to return to the practice of the faith, handed down from our parents and ancestors, an inheritance of much more value than silver or gold.

Advent combines in a beautiful way, the past, present and future of salvation in Jesus Christ, all of which we are part of as members of Christ's Church.

Advent is traditionally described as a time of hope and expectation, and we need always, especially at Advent, to cultivate the virtue of hope. It is one of the three theological virtues, the other two being faith and love. All three theological virtues are essential in a life of committed Christianity. Faith in fact is the basis of our hope, and love is the greatest expression of both faith and hope. But we can't live our faith without hope, and in doing so we can love. Likewise, there cannot be real love without faith or without hope.

The season of Advent is a sacred time in the Church year when we can especially cultivate our hope in the living God. The entire life of the follower of Christ is a time of conversion, of going to God, dropping that which is not of God, and experiencing to the full the promises made to us as a people who are redeemed in the blood of Christ. In him we are called from the darkness of sin and error to the life of grace and happiness in God's Kingdom.

The readings from the sacred scriptures in the season of Advent, especially the Prophet Isaiah, invite us to relive each year in our personal journey, the long-standing and finally fulfilled hope of a redeemer, whom we Christians and Catholics acknowledge as Jesus Christ.

The Gospel today from Luke focuses on the second coming of Jesus and event in the future. Because we cannot anticipate when this will happen, we need to be prepared at all times. Luke counsels us that "the anxieties of daily life" can easily distract us. This certainly can be true just from all the preparations and obligations we can take on with "the holidays".

The message of Adventide is loud and clear: prepare your hearts, for God is sending a Savior, Emmanuel, a name which means "God is with us." What greater gift could be bestowed? May this Advent, the beginning of a new liturgical year, be one of joy for us all, knowing we are making good use of our time and energy for the things of God and receiving the good gifts given to those who are willing to seek first the Kingdom of God.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
