CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

Another name for this Third Sunday of Advent is 'Gaudete Sunday'. The name comes from the 'Introit' or in English, the entrance antiphon. 'Gaudete in Domino Semper...' Rejoice in the Lord Always! This exhortation and invitation to worship comes from Saint Paul's letter to the Philippians. (Phil 4:4-5)

"Rejoice in the Lord always, I say it again rejoice!

Everyone should see how unselfish you are. The Lord is near."

We are about half way through our Advent season. Time is a gift. Originally Advent was a companion season to Lent, lasting 40 days in preparation to celebrate Christmas as we celebrated Easter. However, since the 9th Century it was set at 4 weeks. Today we have the option of rose colored vestments instead of violet to highlight the feeling of joy in preparation for the Christmas feast as well as the second coming of Christ.

The scripture readings today tell us again about a bright future, seemingly a utopia. "Joyful in hope" should be every Christian's theme of life. Christian hope is a strong antidote to despair.

The very poetic reading from Isaiah continues the theme of the Messianic kingdom that we heard about last week. The coming of the Lord is the cause for joy and gladness. This is a poem of joyful hope. "Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication."

We as Christians apply this vision to the future brought about by Jesus. He is the Messiah, God's Anointed One. "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened." The Lord gives sight to the blind. This is our Christian theme of joyful hope, the Lord who comes to be a light to the world. All the Christmas lights we see driving around symbolize this idea!

The question in the Gospel today regarding Jesus is as "the one who is to come'. Jesus' answer to John proves his messianic identity by listing the Messiah's deeds in terms of Isaiah. Jesus affirms John's message of repentance before the reign of God.

As we wait in joyful expectation, at the fulfillment of God's reign there will be no division, no disease, no despair, no sorrow, no mourning. This patience, in joyful waiting is the message of the second reading today. James says to be patient, like a farmer waiting for spring. In doing that, you are going to experience many dark, cold nights.

The Eucharistic meal gives us a foretaste of the life to come. For this we offer our great prayer of thanksgiving and praise.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
