### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u></u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent <b>Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, January 7 at 7 PM.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

### Pastor's Page

The Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as "Gaudete Sunday". *Gaudete* is translated from the Latin as "Rejoice"! This comes from the Introit or Entrance Antiphon for the Mass day. The quote is taken from the Letter of Paul to the Philippians (4:4-5). "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again, I say, Rejoice! Indeed, the Lord is near. "

The Old Testament reading today is from the Book of the Prophet Zephaniah. The book itself is very small, only 3 chapters. Today's passage is a message of hope to the Israelites who have seen the kingdom continue to fall apart and be threatened by the Babylonians. The message can be drawn across to our day, with the message of hope that leads us to rejoice.

Zephaniah talks about "The Lord has removed the judgment against you....the King of Israel, the Lord is in your midst." This is the reason for our joy, God is in our midst.

The second reading continues the Introit. St. Paul challenges us to respond in the most appropriate way to the message: "your kindness should be known to all". Paul then outlines the course of action we should take, knowing that the Lord is near. Prayer and petition with Thanksgiving are correct courses of action.

The Gospel passage from Luke today (3:10-18) sees John preaching and giving some concrete examples of what his baptism of repentance should entail. The people are eager to follow him, and they ask what they should do. "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none". Same with food. It is interesting that even the tax collectors were being baptized and John told them to stop extorting more than was proscribed. Act honorably, be honest.

So many people had hoped that perhaps John was the messiah, the one who was coming to save God's people, the fulfillment of all of the prophecies. Instead, John speaks the truth in his humility and says: I am not the one. There is one coming after me. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

Let us continue to listen to the voices of Advent. We rejoice in God's gifts to us.

### **Parish Resources**

#### <u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
