CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

The four candles on the Advent Wreath are burning brightly. The light attracts us. Today the readings turn to the immediate preparations for the birth of our Lord. We too should be finalizing our preparations for his birth into our hearts once again.

Today's scripture is about signs: God's sign to Ahaz and the angel's appearance to Joseph. Just as in the readings of the second Sunday of Advent, the setting is Jerusalem in the 700's BC during the reign of King Ahaz. God's chosen people are in deep trouble with other nations mainly through the mismanagement of the King. He rejects an offer of a 'sign' which in the Bible is usually some event assuring human beings of divine intervention. The purpose of the reading is that when we are in trouble, going through semi-darkness in our human situations. God is willing to step in, if in faith we allow him to do so.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading in his letter to the Romans, it is through an obedient faith, in the Lord Jesus, "for the sake of his name" that we will be saved. As our responsorial psalm says today, "Let the Lord enter, he is the king of glory". In the Lord Jesus, God is Immanuel -God is with us.

Matthew's Gospel tells us the story of Jesus birth. It follows the genealogy in the first verses of Matthew. Its primary purpose is showing Jesus' right to a place in the messianic genealogy through Joseph. The climax of the story is Joseph's resolve to make Jesus a Davidic child by assuming the legal obligations of paternity. There is a tension between continuity with the Jewish tradition (legal paternity through Joseph) and the sharp break with tradition (the miraculous conception of Jesus).

Engagement or betrothal in Jewish society of Jesus' time involved a much stronger commitment than it does in modern Western society. The description of Joseph's embarrassment and his plans of verses 18-19 are suspicions of Mary that could have been raped or seduced. As a devout observer of the Old Testament Law, Joseph could not take Mary as his wife (see Deuteronomy 22:23-27) Not wishing to subject Mary to a shame-ful trial as one found in adultery, he decided to forego the public procedure and decided to divorce her quietly.

Joseph's plans are interrupted by the appearance of a messenger from God in a dream. The dream allayed Joseph's fears. The angel's message assumes the virginal conception of Jesus by the Holy Spirit and concentrates on the name of the Messiah. It will be Jesus because he will save his people from their sins. This is significant since it is usually the father's right to name the child. Joseph acts in faith and acts in accordance with the divine communication and takes Mary to be his wife. The purpose of the infancy narrative in Matthew serves to situate Jesus firmly within God's people and to call attention to his extraordinary status.

Joseph's heart, his righteousness, enables him to cooperate daringly and decisively in God's saving plan. Let us meditate on how we can open our hearts also to cooperate with God's grace in our lives.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
