#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, January 7 at 7 PM.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance

#### Pastor's Page

Today we light the 4th candle on the Advent wreath. We are on full alert. In the old military readiness parlance we are in stage Defcon 4 as it were. Our spiritual preparation stage to celebrate the nativity can hopefully take on Mary's proclamation in the gospel of Luke: "May it be done to me according to your word."

This event is set up in our Gospel reading today from Luke 1:39-45. Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth. Zechariah her husband has been promised that his son would be filled with the Holy Spirit. Once Jesus is conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit can become active in others. John the Baptist receives the Spirit in the presence of Jesus: the Spirit fills Elizabeth and later Zechariah and Simeon. This visit is filled with joy.

We have heard Mary's response to the angel Gabriel many times yet these words should never cease to amaze us. What a great risk of the unknown Mary was taking in saying yes to God's plan and invitation. Mary was willing to sacrifice her entire self to God.

What could Mary have been thinking when the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid Mary...the Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you." There was great risk in her yes. There would be questions. There were complications. What about her engagement to Joseph?

Gabriel greets Mary announcing the promises made to David will be fulfilled by the child that Mary will bear. But then Gabriel declares what prophets only hinted at in veiled images, what no human power could ever accomplish, however vast its empire, however vast its science.

Through Mary's embrace of her mission, the Incarnation mystery (God becoming a human being) engages us! Because we are baptized into Jesus, Mary's son, we too become Mary's spiritual children. God seeks our cooperation in the ongoing fulfillment of His saving plan.

God's ways are so many times not our ways. The reading on this 4th Sunday of Advent point to the unlikely sources for the blessed event we are about to celebrate. Jesus will be born in Bethlehem, a town unnoticed and for gotten, "too small to be among the clans of Judah." But from this unlikely place will come forth, "one who is to be ruler in Israel."

The son of God will be born to Mary, a seemingly insignificant teenage girl. John the Baptist will be born of Elizabeth, a woman supposedly past childbearing age. As we listen to the word of God today, we are reminded of God's tendency to do the unexpected.

As we go forward today, let us ponder the Scripture message. I would strongly suggest reading the entire first chapter of Luke's Gospel on this 4th Sunday of Advent.

Let us pray for the grace to respond to God's invitations to us as we begin our final preparations for celebrating the fact of God becoming Man. Are we ready?

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
