CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u>** - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, January 7 at 7 PM.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

The solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is a reminder that Christmas is a family feast, and that Jesus was born and raised in a family like us.

Perhaps the greatest threat facing families today is the fact that we don't spend enough time together. We are so busy working, or socializing, watching TV or spending time on the smart phone that we have less and less time for each other. That style can take a big toll on the family.

There is a story about a young lawyer who lived quite a distance from her elderly father. Months had passed since they had been together and when her father called to ask when she might visit, the daughter detailed a list of reasons that prevented her from taking the time to see him. She had court schedule, meetings, new clients, research, etc., etc. At the end of her recitation, the father asked, "When I die, do you intend to come to my funeral?" The daughter's response was immediate, "Dad, I can't believe you'd ask that! Of course, I'll come!" To which the father replied, "Good. Forget the funeral and come; I need you more now than I will then."

The Gospel invites us to focus our attention on how Mary and Joseph faithfully accept their vocation as parents, and on their total submission to God's will. The spirit in which Mary and Joseph lived their parental vocation, is an example to be imitated by parents. The Holy Family is put before us as a model because Mary and Joseph went through many of the trials and obstacles. Mary and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem for the census when Mary was with child. The Holy Family had to flee to Egypt in order to escape from the threat over the life of Jesus by Herod. Mary and Joseph were troubled when they lost their 12 year old boy only to find him in the temple busy with his Father's business. We can also imagine that Mary and Jesus suffered bereavement after Joseph's death.

One may say that Mary and Joseph lived a family spirituality centered on Jesus: they learned to look at Jesus with eyes of faith; to listen to him with attention, and to meditate on the unfolding mystery of the Son of God in their midst. But above all, they loved each other.

Just as the Holy Family survived its crises through love for each other and faith in God, let us pray for our families that they too may follow that example of love and faith in God. The message we take home is two fold:

The example of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph challenges us to find ways of coming together and centering our life on Christ.

We are invited to pray for our own families and those of our relatives and friends, so that, by God's grace, they may overcome the trials and sufferings that face family life today, and experience the presence of Christ in their family life. As we honor the Holy Family today we should also give prayerful thought to the importance of family and the future of the family in our country. The family is in need of all the prayerful support we can provide.





<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
