### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, January 15 at 7pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

### Pastor's Page

Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is a strong reminder that Christmas is a family feast, and that Jesus was born and raised in a family like us. It was introduced into the Liturgical Calendar in 1921, promulgated as a way to honor the Christian family. When I was in grade school at both St. Francis De Sales and later Good Shepherd in Southwest Philadelphia, the Feast of the Holy Family was the only Sunday of the school year when we did not have the children's mass and could go to mass with our parents.

Family is of great importance in the wide scope of God's work here on earth. One might think that the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is too remote, too special, too holy to be an effective model for our families. But just like our families, they enjoyed times of great joy but also suffered through terrible hardships. The delight of a newborn baby was accompanied by the fear that led them to a foreign land. Today we can pray that the faith and love shown by the Holy Family can sustain us through both our joys and struggles.

In the Cycle B first reading today from Genesis, God assures Abram that his descendants will be as numerous as the stars in the sky, though reality at that time told him that the prospects for even one child were bleak. God made a three fold promise to Abram. He will possess a land, he will become a great nation and he will be a blessing to the peoples of the earth. On God's word, Abram has faith.

"Abram put his faith in the Lord, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness." Abram renounced all certainty that can come from human beings. As a result, in old age he and his wife had a son, Isaac. Through that act God reveals his love and faithfulness. Hence the family becomes a sign of the faith of human beings and the love of God.

The faith of Abraham is also the subject of today's second reading. Written toward the end of the first century, Hebrews is in the genre of a homily, but is presented in letter format. The author of this work is unknown. The author sees Abraham's faithful trust in God's promise as exemplary.

While the first two readings today focus on the promise of offspring made to Abraham, the Gospel reading speaks of the fulfillment of that promise in Jesus. In the story today from Luke, Mary and Joseph bring their first born child to the temple to consecrate him to the Lord.

Jesus then is the one who enriches Abraham and his descendants by bestowing on them God's grace. Jesus is the one through whom Abraham and his descendants can hope. Indeed, the fulfillment in Jesus of God's promise to Abraham is so abundant that it overflows beyond the circle of Abraham and his descendants to bless all peoples. As the Gospel passage proclaims today, Jesus is a "light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory for your people Israel."

### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
