#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u></u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent <b>Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

## **Pastor's Page**

On this Second Sunday of Advent our focus is on the time before the first coming of Christ, in history. The Old Testament Reading and the Gospel feature two of the most prominent voices of Advent: Isaiah and John the Baptist.

In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, we see described the peaceable kingdom of God, the day of the Messiah of the Lord, who is of course going to be Jesus. Isaiah has described a glimpse of God's holy mountain, where true justice reigns.

The setting of the first reading is Eighth Century Israel BC and the King of Israel at that time was Ahaz, who though of the Davidic line was totally weak and ineffective as King. Ahaz has in fact brought the country to the brink of ruin, where Isaiah compares it to the stump of a tree, not exactly a symbol brimming with life.

Verses 2-5 describe the attributes of this future king. The spirit of the Lord will be upon him and he will do all that a righteous king should do. Verses 6-9 describe a transformation of nature in his reign. The description is quite fantastic, as it concerns a transformation of animal nature that no king could readily achieve: "A wolf will be a guest of a lamb...the cow and the bear becoming neighbors." It should be obvious that this is poetic passage, a fantasy of an ideal world rather than a prediction of the future. It paints a picture of what an ideal world would be like. The Messiah will come through the 'Davidic' line.

In the Gospel passage from Matthew the theme is preparing for the Lord's coming. Fully accepting him may require a change of life style. John the Baptist speaks clear language not just to the Jews of his time but to us also.

Verse 2 summarizes John's preaching that is also spoken by Jesus himself later in chapter 4, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Both preachers demand a radical conversion of the whole person to God and both urge it as a preparation for the new age when the God of Israel will be acknowledged as the Lord by all creation.

The Jewish historian Josephus (an historical reference totally independent of the Bible) confirms that John the Baptist drew large crowds for his exhortations to justice and piety. He describes John's ritual of baptism as a symbolic action signifying that conversion of heart had taken place.

John the Baptist's message is very strong in Matthew's gospel and he is seen as the precursor to Jesus and his message: Conversion of heart, the coming of God's Kingdom and bearing fruit in good deeds. John is not very well disposed to those who are coming out to the Baptism only for show or empty ritual. He directs some pointed comments to the Pharisees and Sadducees: "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath!" He is also very clear that the one coming after me, "is mightier than I. I am not worth to carry his sandals."

We can look to St. Paul today to sum up the lesson: It is through endurance and by the encouragement of God's Word that we have hope. He entrusts this Word to us and prays that our reflection on it will bring us hope.



#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
