### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, January 7 at 7 PM. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

**<u>RCIA</u>** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

### Pastor's Page

As we enter the second week of our Advent preparation we are invited to reflect on how prepared we are for the Lord's coming. In the first reading today the prophet Baruch talks about making substantial changes. The Lord can help us affect all kinds of changes with his grace. "For God has commanded that every mountain be made low, and that age old depths and gorges be filled to ground level." Are there mountains and other obstacles in our path that block our way to holiness?

Advent is a time of joyful waiting. The scripture readings this week are unfailingly positive, hopeful for the future. Baruch assures Jerusalem that God is leading His exiled people back home. The setting is during the Babylonian Exile (587-538). Baruch encouraged the people during the exile, reminding them of Jeremiah's preaching. There would be big changes if they remained faithful to God and cooperated with his plan.

Jerusalem had been conquered by the Babylonians and many of the population had been exiled to Babylon. Baruch envisioned the day when the Chosen People would return to the holy city. He holds out God's promise of transformation, when misery will change to joy.

The Gospel today is from the third chapter of Luke. John the Baptist is preaching throughout the whole region of the Jordan. The Baptism of Repentance is both wonderful and challenging. Baptism means an immersion, going "all in" as it may be said. A Baptism is cleansing and life giving. Repentance is also a challenge. It is a call to turn away from sin or ways that keep us from God. We truly feel remorse for what we have done. Then change can happen. Paths and winding roads can be made straight. God acts in our lives, but we must act as well. God's grace does not limit our responsibility. It enhances it.

St. Paul gives us a very good prayer in the Epistle. It is his prayer for the people at the Church of Philippi. He says "the one who began the good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ." It is a very timely prayer for us also at this time of year. We need to be attentive to the second half of his prayer as well, to discern what is of value so that we can live lives that are seeking the good.

## Parish Resources

### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
