### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

### Pastor's Page

It seems like we have just settled into 2024 and already we are looking at the beginning of yet another liturgical season as we begin the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 14.

Lent is a time for us to acknowledge that we are sinners and that we are saved through God's abundant love. Our journey of conversion during Lent serves as a reminder to all of us that God's work of redemption and salvation continues in our midst.

On Ash Wednesday in the first reading at Mass, the prophet Joel tells us to rend our hearts not our garments. Jesus himself is going to tell us in Matthew's gospel that our conversion begins within and not with showy outward signs. Now is the acceptable time to lift our heart to God who is gracious and merciful. We need to let the ashes on our dependence on the God who made us. He invites us to renew our lives through the traditional ways of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This will prepare us to celebrate Easter in a most fitting way.

Mass and Distribution of Ashes will take place at 8:30 AM, 12:00 PM and 7:30 PM.

Here are some of the additional ways we can observe Lent at IHM.

#### **Prayer**

Mass: Each weekday we will have Mass at 8:30AM in the Sacred Heart Chapel. On Wednesdays, when school is in session it will be in the Church.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Each Saturday from 4PM to 5 PM.

Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: All day Tuesdays from after the 8:30AM Mass until Miraculous Medal Novena and Benediction at 6:30 PM.

#### **Fasting**

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further all person eighteen years of age and older up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

#### Almsgiving

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry person here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and the world. The Poor Boxes in our Church and Chapel directly fund the excellent work of the St. Vincent dePaul Society of IHM Parish, as well as the Ash Wednesday Church Envelope in your February packet.

May our journey of Forty Days with the Lord into the desert help us arrive with him to celebrate Easter in the best way possible.

### Parish Resources

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
