CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

The teachings during this cycle of readings from Matthew's Gospel tell us that living the Christian life is more than just rules and regulations, more than just a series of do's and don'ts. Jesus calls us to a higher standard than this. If we focus only on the letter of the law we will probably do only what is absolutely necessary to get by. Our prayer this weekend can be for the grace and the courage and the will to go beyond the letter of the law. We can seek to follow Jesus with open hearts which will take us to places we can only imagine.

Sirach exhorts us in the first reading: "God has set before you fire and water...life and death, good and evil, whichever you choose will be given to you." Human freedom means we can chose good and avoid evil. God is not the source of human sin. Free will goes back to the beginning of the creation of man in Genesis. This is one of the gifts of our human nature. Good or evil cannot be forced on us. We are inclined to choose the good, because of God's grace we are part of his good creation. However, as humans we can make the wrong choices.

In the second reading, St. Paul talks about a wisdom that is higher than human wisdom. It is the sharing in the life of God. That wisdom, the insight of faith, can help us to make the right decisions in situations where we can choose a right path, a wrong path or at least a better of two choices path. This is when we pray that the Spirit will give us proper discernment in confusing situations.

In the Gospel we have the continuation of the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew chapters 5-7. Jesus is speaking of his own authority: "You have heard it was said to your ancestors....but I say to you." In other words we need to pay particular attention. It is more than just laws or do's and don'ts. Jesus is calling us to a higher way of living. He tells us that unless our righteousness surpasses the scribes and the Pharisees we cannot enter the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus starts off with the 5th Commandment. Very simple. "Thou shalt not commit murder". Jesus upholds this law and then amplifies it in his commandment against anger. Left unresolved, anger can cause resentment and lead to the death of a relationship or even of a life itself. We can go all the way back to the Cain and Abel story in Genesis to see this. Jesus insists the reconciliation of a relationship is of the highest priority, even higher than one's relationship with God. (Go first and be reconciled....and then come and offer your gift. Matthew 5:24) The law is only the beginning of justice and mercy. Angry thoughts, insulting murmuring, abusive words. These are what Jesus is counseling us to control and avoid.

Let us listen carefully to Jesus instruction, as he invites us to live more deeply in the life of the Father he wants to share with us. It is not enough to simply observe every commandment outwardly. We need to change our interior disposition so we can internalize God's Law, which is ultimately Life in Christ. In Jesus is revealed a new wisdom, a new law, a new way of living.



Parish Resources

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
