CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is March 11 @ 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Spring Session is May 31. See more information on page 5 of the bulletin.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

The message in the first reading today highlights how important it is that we place our trust in the Lord. He warns that the person who puts his strength in the flesh is doomed to disappointment. A life of mere prosperity, pleasure and prestige is like a barren bush in the desert. It bears no lasting fruit, displays no lasting beauty. He ultimately enjoys no vibrant life.

Jeremiah is contrasting the true and the false Israelite. Jeremiah's observations are contrasting the mysterious workings of the human heart and conclude with a declaration of doom for those who forsake God.

"Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord". Jeremiah 17:5

Jeremiah then contrasts the person who puts his trust in the Lord. Such a person is like a tree "planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream. It fears not the heat when it comes, its leaves stay green."

Jeremiah 17: 8

In our continuing reading from the Epistle to the Corinthians the past couple weeks, Saint Paul asks 'How can we live as if this life alone matters'. Death is the great enemy of all worldly goods. What good will our money, our pastimes, material goods accrued do for us when we leave this world. Life truly matters only if it points to something beyond this world.

Many of the people in Corinth have denied the possibility of the resurrection from the dead. Is this a lie? Is faith in vain? The resurrection of believers hinges on the resurrection of Christ. He says if those who have died have no hope, believers are the most pitiable of people.

"If the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is in vain; you are still in your sins." 1 Corinthians 15: 16-17

Today in the Gospel we hear Luke's version of the Beatitudes. The differences between this passage and the eight beatitudes are striking. Instead of staying on the mountain to deliver his discourse, Jesus comes down from the mountain like Moses descending to deliver the law to the people (Exodus 34:15) As before, the people crowd around him to hear the word of God and to be healed.

The Lukan version of the Beatitudes is also more challenging. Luke's "Blesseds" are immediately followed by "woes". Jesus gives his blessing to the poor and heaped scorn upon the rich. He obviously cared and cared deeply about the disparity between the rich and the poor. It troubled him that some people have too little while others have too much. He wondered why those with much are reluctant to help the poor. To Jesus the rich were anyone who could meet all of their own needs with a little left over. His "woes" applied to those who could help someone else a little but did not.

As we ponder Luke's teaching on the Beatitudes today, let us pray that God's grace can transform us on our journey of conversion.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
