### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>**Baptism**</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is March 11 @ 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Spring Session is May 31. See more information on page 5 of the bulletin.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

# Pastor's Page

It is fairly unusual that the celebration of a feast takes precedence over the celebration of the Sunday liturgy, this week, the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary time. It is the case however this year. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Forty days after Jesus was born, in accordance with the Torah, or the Law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought the child to the Temple in Jerusalem to be presented to the Lord. Today marks his first visit to Jerusalem. It will not be his last.

Jesus parents obeyed the imperial law at the time of Jesus birth and now they are portrayed as observant Jews, fulfilling the prescriptions of the religious law. The scene today at the temple has Luke entwining two separate ceremonies. Leviticus describes the ceremony for the ritual purification of the mother forty days after giving birth. Leviticus prescribed that she was to offer a lamb and a pigeon or a turtledove, but a poor couple was permitted to bring only two pigeons or doves as Luke describes (Lk 2:24)

We had something similar in days gone by with the "Churching of Women". I remember this as a child, and I remember my mother approaching the altar after the births of my younger sister and brother after mass one Sunday. After mass you would see women approaching the altar rail and the priest coming out of the sacristy and offering the blessing. Basically it was a blessing given to mothers after recovery from childbirth. It was not a precept of the church but was a pious and praiseworthy custom. Part of that custom was that the mother sometimes did not participate in the Baptism ceremony and that the Godmother held the baby. That is not the case anymore. Both parents are involved in the Baptism ceremony.

The second part is that the Book of Exodus required the presentation and redemption of the first-born son because the first-born sons "belong" to the Lord who saved them when the Egyptian first born were destroyed at the Passover. It is this part of the ceremony that Luke is emphasizing today. The temple signifies for Luke the continuity between Judaism and Christianity. Simeon and Anna are faithful humble Israelites waiting in the temple for the revelation of God's salvation. Just and pious they are open to the Holy Spirit's inspiration.

Simeon recognizes Jesus as the Anointed of the Lord and in his speech (Lk 2:29-32) further prophesies that Jesus will be a "light for revelation to the Gentiles". In blessing Mary and Joseph he warns that this child will be a sign opposed and that Mary will be pierced with a sword.

The first reading from Malachi gives us a heads up on the events to come: "And suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek, and the messenger of the covenant whom you desire. Yes, he is coming." Simeon and Anna recognize this in the infant Jesus, the "Christ of the Lord" whom they had sought.

At the first mass of the Presentation, at the Vigil, we will bless the altar candles which will be used at Mass in Church and in the Sacred Heart Chapel throughout the year.

As we celebrate this special feast today, let us take the testimony of Simeon and Anna to heart and challenge ourselves to recognize Jesus in our everyday lives and in the faces of those we meet.



### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
