#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**Baptism** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is March 11 @ 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Spring Session is May 31. See more information on page 5 of the bulletin.

<u>**RCIA</u>** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).</u>

## Pastor's Page

This Sunday we continue with Luke's Gospel. This section continues Jesus' instruction on true discipleship. In this section Jesus challenges us to continue to seek perfection. The Golden Rule is spelled out: "Do to others as you would have them do to you." This sometimes requires us to place ourselves in the other person's shoes. It sometimes requires imagination. It can be helpful to have an appreciation of the other person's plight or station in life. It definitely requires an empathy toward the other person.

One of the first things we learn about ourselves, as human beings, is we are created in the 'image and likeness of God'. What exactly does that mean? It means if we truly want to follow Jesus as a disciple, we should want to reflect the goodness of God in our own lives. Jesus commands us to show mercy to those who hurt us. "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." We are called to be merciful not just because it is the right thing to do, but because God is merciful and we are called to reflect the goodness that God projects. Since we are created in the image of God, and God is merciful, we are created to be merciful.

This is not some additional feature that Jesus is throwing out there and telling his disciples to do. This is part of our constitution, our humanity. It is not an accident that the word *humane* is often used as a synonym for *merciful*. To be human is to be merciful.

We can see Jesus offering us the extreme example of mercy when he died on the cross. Today's passage is not regarded as a prediction of his passion, but it could be. Everything that he said to his disciples on this occasion early in his ministry, happened to him on Good Friday. He was hated, he was cursed, he was mistreated. He was struck on the cheek, his cloak was taken away from him. Jesus forgave them all, saying on the cross, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34)

The exhortation to "lend expecting nothing back" is another practical example of living out discipleship. In biblical times, money did not yet have the commercial function it has now. There is a big difference between a bank granting a business loan or a mortgage and an individual helping a friend as well as possible under trying circumstances.

The passage concludes with some practical everyday examples: Stop judging, stop condemning. Forgive. Give to others without counting the cost. This can spread even more good will. "Give and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down and overflowing, will be poured into your lap". Jesus further says we will receive return in proportion to how we give. "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

Today let us listen for what God is calling us to do, as we reflect the goodness, life and light of Christ in our lives. In the responsorial psalm today we will sing the refrain, "The Lord is kind and merciful". We are called to be as well.



### **Parish Resources**

#### <u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
