CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, March 14 @ 7 pm in the Church. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. Pastor's Page

The scripture readings today remind us that we are faced with choices in our lives. These choices can either move us closer to God or move us away from him. As we will see from Genesis to Matthew today, the transgression of Adam and Eve is overcome by the righteousness of Jesus.

In Genesis, we see the character of the serpent introduced into the story. In Canaan, the promised land that the Hebrews moved into a serpent was associated with pagan fertility cults which were a constant source of temptation to Israel. Israel often fell into these things. The choice of a serpent to represent the tempter of humanity is the author's way of saying: "Don't get involved with these things, they will only cause you trouble as they did for the first man and woman."

A big question we may have is why the serpent engages the woman in conversation and not the man. Could it be they see the woman as inherently weak, incurably curious or could she be viewed as much stronger than the man. If she can be made to sin, man will automatically follow. There is no definite answer to this. The bottom line is they both listen to the serpent, disobey God and chose to sin.

The bottom line is God as the creator, has given man great gifts. Man is created with an intellect and free will. There is a limit placed on humanity. Some things are objectively wrong in themselves. Humanity can know many things, but who is to decide what is best for humanity – the God who created humanity or the creature who was created? The problem is that humanity overstepped the limit imposed by God. This becomes in itself rebellion against the creator, ruptures the relationship. That is the essence of sin.

The Gospel today is Matthew's version of the Temptation of Jesus in the desert. This story is related in each of the synoptic gospels (Mark, Luke and Matthew). Mark's narrative of the testing of Jesus contains only two verses, but Luke and Matthew provide a lengthy debate in which the devil presents three tests and Jesus answers with three quotations from the Book of Deuteronomy.

The three tests show that Jesus does not seek to satisfy his own material needs or to make a miraculous display of his status or power or enter into a relationship with the devil for the sake of political authority. Jesus emerges from this period in the desert and the temptation totally obedient to the will of the Father, especially as that will is expressed in the words of the Old Testament scriptures.

This story provides a model for us who may be tempted to pay too much attention to material goods or to seek influence and wealth without regard for justice and morality. Jesus sojourn in the desert can be a model for our Forty Day Lenten observance.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
