<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance

Pastor's Page

We hear many times the expression, "He/she has the patience of Job". The passage today gives us a fuller picture of Job and what he faced. "The Book of Job is part of a group of Old Testament writings known as Wisdom Literature. The story of Job is that of a righteous man upon whom God inflicts great suffering in order to test Job's fortitude. Central to the theme is wrestling with the question of the suffering of the innocent. Scholarship tells us that Job is not an historical figure and the details related throughout the book are not to be taken literally as objective history. As Jesus relates later, God the Father does not randomly pick out people to inflict torture upon in dialogue with the devil as a sort of experiment or sport.

We can learn as we read from Job that we can have the courage to raise our voice to God in prayer, sharing our disappointments and sorrows. Job is in the throes of despair. His days are miserable, his nights are troubled. Yet, he is addressing his lament to God. Expressing lament is a valid form of prayer. At this time we pray for the type of healing that comes only through Jesus. Somewhere inside Job must have had glimmer of hope—a hope that God will hear him. If we take some time to read through the conclusion of the Book, we see that God does respond.

In our passage from Mark today, we see the quick movements of Jesus as he begins his powerful ministry. (1:29-39). Mark has Jesus move immediately from his first powerful miracle to another. The visit to Simon's mother –in-law turns into a second sign that God's kingdom of wholeness is present in Him. In verse 25 he cured with a word. Here he cures with a touch (1:31). His touch saves surely as his word. The fact that the woman's cure is immediate and total is made clear by Mark's emphasis on how she resumes her duties of hospitality as she waits on her guests.

His first day of preaching and healing has given them hope that God is at work among them. Mark presents Jesus as being very reserved about letting his reputation as a miracle worker spread. This reticence is called by scripture scholars, "the messianic secret". In emphasizing such secrecy regarding Jesus' identity as the Messiah, Mark hopes that his Christian readers will accept Jesus' true identity, on his terms in the contact of his entire life and mission. Mark's Jesus will reveal himself as Messiah by being powerless on the Cross. Christians are free to proclaim Jesus as their Messiah and Lord only when they accept his way of suffering messiahship along with his miraculous works.

We conclude today with Simon informing Jesus that everyone is seeking him. Jesus responds that he must travel to other villages and preach, "for this purpose I have come". This signals that the healing and casting out of demons are not the goal of Jesus' ministry but are simply signs that the reign of God is at hand.

Today we see and hear Job in his suffering and lament. The people who encounter Jesus today in the Gospel are full of hope. We can see ourselves in both situations. Let us continually remind ourselves of the healing grace of Jesus in his Word and Sacrament.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
