### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is March 11 @ 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Spring Session is May 31. See more information on page 5 of the bulletin.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

# Pastor's Page

An unlikely thread links the three who are called to be disciples in today's reading. All pronounce themselves unworthy.

Isaiah, Paul and Peter are disciples who each see themselves as sinners and unworthy of the call they have received. As we listen to the readings today, we need to realize that even though we to are unworthy, God still calls us to be disciples.

Isaiah felt totally unworthy to answer God's call. He felt totally overwhelmed by the holiness of God. How could he measure up to such purity and power? God empowered Isaiah to do his work by cleansing his lips and purging his heart. After this process, his final answer to God's call is important: "Here I am, send me"!

In the second reading from Corinthians, we can see that Paul had an experience similar to Isaiah's awareness of God's presence in the Temple. He also shows a feeling of being unworthy. He gives credit to God: "Only by the grace of God I am what I am." This enabled him to carry the Good News far and wide.

In the Gospel, Peter as usual gets right to the point: "Depart from me Lord, for I am a sinful man." Simon was a fisherman when he first met Jesus. This was how he earned his living. Like all fisherman, Simon had his good days and his bad days. Over the long haul he must have caught enough fish to stay in business. There were days though when he went home empty handed.

Today, we hear on of the times when it did not go so well. At least that's how it started out. Simon and his crew had fished all night and caught nothing. The next morning they were on the shore, cleaning their nets. Jesus walked upon that scene, and ended up sitting in Simon's boat while he taught people on the shore. Afterwards, he instructed Simon to push out into deep water and let down his nets for a catch. Simon was skeptical. They had already been out all night and now they were going back out at a time when there would probably be no fish.

Simon-Peter did what the Lord asked, but he seemed skeptical. To his utter amazement, they caught so many fish that the nets could hardly hold them. Simon knew after that he was in the presence of someone very special. He was then overwhelmed by a feeling of his own unworthiness. Jesus told him: "Do not be afraid. From now on you will be catching men."

Simon had some good reasons to feel unworthy. He was hot tempered, impetuous and a times a bigoted man. Christ accepted all that and worked wit h it. In effect, he said, "This is what your are. Let's start with that and see what you can do with it." His name will be changed from Simon to Peter. He will be the spiritual rock. It is a substantial change.

The conclusion is they left everything and followed Him. This is quite a transformation. We are all called to be disciples. Our challenge is to take what we have, let the Lord's grace transform us and follow Jesus to the best of our ability.

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
