CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is January 9, at 7pm in the Chapel.

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

On this first day of the Year of Our Lord 2023, we look forward to new beginnings, hopeful that this year will be better than the last. In our first reading today from the Book of Numbers, the chosen people were looking forward to a new beginning in the promised land when Aaron and his sons called down God's blessings, God's grace and God's peace upon them. The liturgy choses this passage from Numbers and invokes this triple blessing the beginning of the civil year and at other times when there is a need to implore God's blessing on the entire community, The Book of Numbers is the fourth book of the Pentateuch. It tells the story of God's people as they journey through the wilderness enroute to the Promised Land of Canaan. As Numbers unfolds there are many ups and downs as the people are tested in their faith.

We also honor Mary today. Mary's willing obedience to God's plan enabled the Incarnation. Luke says that Mary reflected on the shepherd's visit and their message. The shepherds realized a new beginning was taking place in Bethlehem and hurried there to see the newborn King. The Shepherds are Jesus' first evangelizers, proclaiming the "good news of great joy" given them by the Angels (Luke 2:10). Ironically the first people they tell are Mary and Joseph themselves, who already know the good news from the angel's visits to them. Now however they see tangible proof that the good news is already spreading throughout the countryside, bringing great joy to all who hear it. Mary treasured all that happened as she reflected on the shepherd's visit and their message.

Mary, as we hear in Luke, embraced the new beginning her life had taken after she was visited by the angel. We hear this in the wonderful prayer known as the Magnificat: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my savior."

As the new year dawns, we realize the blessings that we have been given. God blessed the chosen people as they invoked his Name. We are blessed as sons and daughters, able to call God, "Abba", Father. Like the shepherds who heard the message of the angels and went to find the Word made flesh, let us listen to the Word of God today, and then go forth praising and glorifying God.



SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
