CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance

Pastor's Page

You may have asked what happened to the First Sunday in Ordinary Time. That would have been last week with the celebration of the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. Last Monday began Ordinary Time (and Green Vestments), the sign of hope. That Solemnity was a reminder of our own Baptism, by which we became members of not only the Church, but welcomed into the life of the Trinity. When we are baptized we are called by name. As the priest or deacon pours the water he calls our name and says, "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." It is a beginning not an end.

The Scripture readings for this Second Sunday in Ordinary Time narrate a number of awesome events. Ancient Jerusalem has been restored to prominence. Early Christians are unlocking the power of healing that Jesus has given and also speaking in tongues. Jesus changes water into wine. All of these are signs of the power of God and are attributable to the Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Our second reading today is from the first letter of St. Paul to the Church at Corinth. In Corinthians, we learn more about Paul from Paul than in any other New Testament work. At various parts of the letter, Paul can be seen admonishing, cajoling, defending, challenging and authoritative. Paul's tone is firm but compassionate, intimate and challenging.

Corinth was a very cosmopolitan city. Any religion would have a hard time being taken seriously there. This is especially true of Christianity as preached by a suspect Jewish convert who felt called to preach to the Gentiles and who hoped that his fellow Jews would accept the gospel of Jesus Christ. Raised on a Greek influenced Body=Soul dichotomy that was part of the Greek world, the Corinthians had a hard time understanding Paul's semitic perspective.

In today's passage, Paul emphasizes that the proclamation of Jesus as Lord can only be made through the Holy Spirit. The same Spirit who gives the gift of faith distributes all the other gifts. The Spirit brings the variety of gifts into a marvelous unity. Experience shows however, that even gifts can be divisive if faith, not only in Christ, but also the Church is not strong. Even good gifts can result in envy, pride, arrogance, exclusiveness. The Spirit is required to help the church to use the gifts to effect unity.

Today in the Gospel, Jesus is in the small town of Cana, north in Galilee. The first of the "signs" in John is the arrival through Jesus of the new Messianic Age. What is changed in this story is not simply water, but water for the Old Testament ceremonial washings. It is changed not only into wine, but into wine of the highest quality and of surprising quantity. Such a superabundance of wine was a frequent prophetic figure of speech for the dawning of the messianic age. For John, this is passing of the old into the new. The Messianic Era has arrived.

John has also used this story to initiate his theology of glory. This is the beginning of John's conception of glory as being "God's manifested presence". God glorifies us when he manifests himself in us; we glorify him when we manifest him to the world. In this instance at Cana, God is manifested in his Son, the Revealer. As we gather around at the altar today, let our presence truly reflect the Lord's goodness.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
