CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

Our first reading today from Isaiah sounds as if we are still in the Christmas season: "the people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." Paired with today's Gospel, which repeats that phrase, it gives a powerful look at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and the calling of the first apostles.

Isaiah tells us that we who once walked in darkness have seen a great light. For the Jews of the Babylonian exile, they will be returning to Jerusalem. Isaiah dreams about an ideal king to come, who will be a true king of peace, a leader for the people, who will be Emmanuel, God with us. For us the light will be Jesus himself. Our journey brings us into God's love. The psalm refrain proclaims this today, "The Lord is my light and my salvation."

In the three-year cycle of readings for this liturgical year, Year A, we will concentrate on Matthew's Gospel. Each year focuses on one of the synoptic gospels. Matthew's gospel was the third gospel written chronologically, written sometime between 80-90 AD. Matthew was a Jew writing primarily for Christians of Jewish heritage who were converts to the faith. They would be very familiar with all the Old Testament references. It features a particular desire by the author to show Jesus was clearly the Messiah they awaited.

Matthew's Gospel also emphasizes that all of Jesus' life was a fulfillment of the promises made by God to Israel. Jesus is presented as a true teacher of the Jewish law, or as "the new Moses". More than 130 passages in the Gospel of Matthew refer either directly or indirectly to the Old Testament. Because the Gospel of Matthew contains Jesus teaching in such a through well organized and understandable manner, it quickly became the most popular and widely used of all the Gospels in the early church, especially when educating new Christians. Its sensitivity to the continuity between Christianity and Judaism also made the gospel valuable for Jews who were inquiring about the faith. This may explain in part why the Matthew's Gospel appears first in printed New Testaments, even though it was written third chronologically.

The main message on this third Sunday on the gospel is this: Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand. Jesus goes to the margins to begin his public ministry. Jesus begins his ministry in Galilee rather than in Jerusalem and Judea. The northern regions were looked upon as "beyond the Jordan" It is on Israel's edge in more ways than one. At the crossroads of Jewish and Gentile society, Capernaum is populated by people on the edge of or even outside the Law.

The account of the call of the first disciples emphasizes the extraordinary attractiveness and magnetism of Jesus. It also introduces three of the disciples who will form Jesus' inner circle among the twelve: Peter, James and John. Jewish teachers did not usually call their own disciples. Prospective disciples generally sought out a teacher with a good reputation for learning and holiness. They encounter Jesus in their everyday occupation of fishing in the Sea of Galilee, an important part of the Jewish economy. Without any preparation and with little or no deliberation they leave behind their business and families to follow Jesus. The descriptive words "at once" suggests how appealing the invitation to join Jesus must have been. Discipleship involves sharing in the mission and this also is stressed.

As we listen to the stories in Matthew let us consider how we can fulfill our calls to discipleship and fulfill our baptismal call.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
