CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u>** - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is March 11 @ 7 pm in the Chapel.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Spring Session is May 31. See more information on page 5 of the bulletin.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

Last week we heard the passage from John's Gospel as Jesus began his public ministry by changing the water into wine at Cana. It symbolized the beginning of the Messianic era. Today we hear Luke's account of the beginning of the public ministry. It is a different story that proclaims the same truth, the beginning of the Messianic era. "Today," Jesus said, "this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

The Old Testament reading today is taken from the Book of Nehemiah. The renewal of the Jewish community after the Babylonian exile (587-538 BC) came through two important leaders. Nehemiah was a governor and Ezra was a priest. Together they gave the people what they desperately needed at the time, a sense of the people's identity as Jews. Nehemiah and Ezra labored at a time while Judah was under the reign of a tolerant Persian empire. Nehemiah, a Jew, has a privileged position in the court of the Persian King. Nehemiah travels to Jerusalem.

The episode in today's reading occurs soon after Ezra brought a contingent of Jews back to Jerusalem. This may have been the first time that they heard the word of God proclaimed publically. They became quite emotional. "He read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law." This is cause for great rejoicing.

Our Gospel passage today jumps from the first chapter of Luke as an introduction to the fourth chapter. Jesus is initially met with acclaim and praise, but this response sours through jealously and suspicion. As an observant Jew, Jesus worshipped in the synagogue. Today, Jesus takes the scroll and reads Isaiah, reading a promise of the restoration of Israel. The original context is the anointing of a prophet. The figure of the promised Messiah, the kingly Anointed One is also implied in Jesus' use of the text. He is the spirit bearer foretold by Isaiah, the prophet and Messiah who will usher in a new age of freedom and divine favor.

The people in the synagogue that day had a unique experience. They definitely had never heard anyone say, "Today, this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Jesus is the manifestation of the one prophesied by Isaiah. Jesus was filled with the Spirit, chosen by God, called to bring glad tidings to the poor.

We know when we gather in his name Jesus is present. Therefore, this Scripture passage is fulfilled right now in our hearing and every time we gather to celebrate the Eucharist.


There are available weeks for roses both in the Church and Chapel and also the Sanctuary Light in the Chapel for 2025.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
