#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

**<u>Pre-Jordan</u>** - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. ### Pastor's Page

Ordinary Time gives us the opportunity to focus on the everyday aspects of our faith and realize their continuity through history. Today we can look at the value of humility. Centuries before Jesus, Zephaniah told the people of Judah to seek humility. "Seek the Lord, all you humble of the earth" we hear in today's Old Testament Passage. We only rarely hear Zephaniah in the Sunday or Daily scripture passages so we should give him particular attention today.

Zephaniah is unique among the biblical prophets in that he descended apparently from the royal house of David, being a great-great grandson of King Hezekiah (715-686 BC). Later during the reign of King Josiah (641-609 BC) Zephaniah announced in bold and colorful rhetoric the imminent arrival of the "Day of the Lord" which he described as a day of definitive judgment on all the people of the earth, including and especially the people of Judah. There is a message of hope though. The humble remnant of Israel that survives the wrathful "day of the Lord" will find refuge in the Lord, who will comfort them. The humble and lowly remnant of God will gather at the place of worship: the "holy mountain that is Zion/Jerusalem.

Zephaniah's image of the "people humble and lowly" is taken up in the preaching of Jesus, as he proclaims the Good News to the poor. Zephaniah is proclaimed this Sunday paired with the Beatitudes in order to show that Jesus' concept of the "poor in spirit" who will receive the Kingdom of Heaven is a development of the prophetic theme of the humble and righteous remnant. The community of disciples gathered around Jesus is the "people humble and lowly", that prophesied by Zephaniah and this community becomes the Church.

The Gospel today is the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12). First we should recognize that when Jesus goes up on a mountain to teach, it evokes the role of Moses. Moses was the great teacher of Israel, who climbed Mount Sinai to teach the Law of God. Matthew is presenting Jesus as the new Moses, who will teach a better law and correct some of the compromises that Moses introduced into Israel's legislation. Jesus is teaching of his own authority. He himself is that Word of God.

The Beatitudes are the introduction to the whole Sermon on the Mount which runs from Chapter 5 to 7. The Beatitudes are about the kingdom of heaven. They are about specifically the virtues that are required of kingdom citizens. They are not simply a random grab bag of virtues, but there is a certain progression as we move through them. They are all interrelated and to a certain extent they move from one to the next.

Jesus is the Son of David, come to reestablish the kingdom of the Lord on earth. But Jesus kingdom is an upside-down kingdom that calls good what the world calls bad and bad that the world calls good. This Sunday's readings call us to leave the ways of the world and practice the virtues of Citizens of the Kingdom.

### **Parish Resources**

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
