## **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**<u>Baptism</u>** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, January 7 at 7 PM. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

## Pastor's Page

Today we hear how God's very self is revealed to people of all nations through the Incarnation. The readings today reflect the joy of this event –the Epiphany of the Lord.

Isaiah tells us today in the first reading: "Rise up in splendor Jerusalem, your light has come. The glory of the Lord shines upon you." The context of this reading is at the end of the Babylonian exile, in 538 B. The Jews now free to return make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. The author envisions all nations joining in this pilgrimage. It is a prophecy of God manifesting himself in Jesus Christ, who is a light shining in the darkness of the human condition. The Gentiles responding to this revelation of God in Jesus are symbolized by the Magi in our Gospel reading today.

God's Epiphany (self-manifestation) in Jesus Christ is for all. We need to search out Jesus' light as did the Magi. That search has brought us to the holy place to meet Jesus. The Magi were wise men, astrologers. They saw a light that was unusual. In the Natural realm, it could have been the conjunction of the Jupiter and Venus. It would have been bright, somewhat like when we have seen Venus very bright in the early evening as it reflects the sunlight in the southwestern sky.

The Magi prostrate themselves in homage and offer gifts symbolizing kingly authority, universal but peaceful (Gold) priestly service, divine yet compassionate (frankincense) and a messianic mission of self-sacrificing love (myrrh). This trio of astrologers journey not to the city of Kings, but Bethlehem, the city of David.

On Epiphany, there is the ancient custom in the church of announcing the dates of the movable feasts for the coming year. In the days before calendars were common, most people did not know the dates for the upcoming liturgical year. On Epiphany Sunday the upcoming dates were "proclaimed". While a day like Christmas is fixed in our minds and on the calendars on December 25th, many of the important feasts of the Church year move, based upon the date that Easter is set. Easter changes each year moving to the Sunday after the "Paschal Full Moon," and can fall between March 22 and April 25.

The Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year. Below is the Epiphany Proclamation for the Year of Our Lord 2025.

#### **Epiphany Proclamation 2025**

Now, dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the **5th** day of **March** will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the **20th** day of **April** you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the **29th** day of **May** will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ On the **8th** day of **June**, the feast of Pentecost.

On the 22nd day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the **30th** day of **November**, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory forever and ever.


## New Beginnings II

## **Parish Resources**

#### <u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
