Pastor's Page

Today's first reading is taken from the Book of Deuteronomy. Deuteronomy is part of the "Pentateuch" (literally from the Greek meaning "five books"), the first five books of the Bible. They are Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy. Deuteronomy means 'second law'. The heart of Israel's story is told in the first five books of the Bible. The Jews refer to these books as the "Torah", a Hebrew word that means "instruction" but is sometimes translated as "the Law". When Jesus is referring to the "Law and the Prophets' he is referring to these 5 books when mentioning the law.

Deuteronomy is set into a framework of 3 sermons by Moses to the Israelites as they are poised to enter the promised land. Moses is delivering a passionate message to his people. He tries to inspire them to be faithful to the covenant where many temptations will await them, temptations to idolatry, wealth and to trusting in their own power instead of God's. Sounds familiar doesn't it?

In this section the people are called together to ratify the covenant that they have just received. Moses emphasizes that the people are to respond to the law with their whole heart and being. The command is not distant, or difficult to understand.

To prevent Israel from becoming discouraged by its failures, God will provide an inner source of commitment. Moses assures the people that living out this commitment is not an impossible task. The law is a guide to practical living.

The Gospel passage from Luke today is the parable of the Good Samaritan. To the Jews of the time, there was no such a thing as a 'Good' Samaritan'. Samaritans were despised and ridiculed by Jews. This parable shows a Samaritan performing a loving service avoided by Jewish religious leaders. This would have been shocking and for many Jews unbelievable and unacceptable. In the previous chapter of Luke, Jesus had sent messengers ahead of him to prepare for his journey to Jerusalem, but they were treated inhospitably in Samaria.

The Good Samaritan parable was/is a good instruction of the fulfillment of the love commandment. The lawyer's question implies that someone is not my neighbor. Jesus story replies that there is no one who is not my neighbor. Neighbor is not a matter of blood bonds or nationality or religious communion. It is determined by the attitude a person has toward others.

The Priest and Levite were well versed in the demands of God's law and like the lawyer would have been able to interpret it for others. They would have avoided the wounded man out of concerns for ritual impurity. The Samaritan would have had no such limitation. He responded out of compassion. The priest and Levite in the parable missed its deepest purpose, while the Samaritan by practicing love, showed that he understood the law.

At the end of the Good Samaritan story, the answer to the question about who was neighbor to the robber's victim is, "The one who treated him with mercy". Let us ask for God's grace to help us be merciful to all our neighbors.





<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
