#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is September 3 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Fall date to be announced.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

#### Pastor's Page

When we last saw the Apostles in the conclusion to last week's Gospel, Jesus had sent them out, two by two, to preach repentance, to cast out demons and anoint the sick. In today's passage from Mark's Gospel, they have reported back to Jesus after their mission. This will be a time of rest and reflection. At Jesus' invitation, "come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while."

Just as Jesus summoned the disciples to a deserted place for rest, so to on our journey of faith we also need time to rest and reflect with Jesus. In the midst of our own busy lives, we also can take Jesus up on this invitation. Run down batteries need to be recharged. This can be a challenge but it is worth the effort. Each person is different. We are fortunate at IHM that we have our Sacred Heart Chapel that we can visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Even a quiet 10 minute visit where we simply sit and listen to Jesus in the silence can be very beneficial. As members of his flock, we too, need to return to Jesus for instruction and rejuvenation.

We can make all sorts of excuses for not seeking that deserted place where we can be present with Jesus either in his Word or Sacrament. Finding the time for quiet prayer is no easy task. We can have so many things to do that spending time engaged in something that has what seems like little immediate payoff ends up being low on our priority list. We see in the gospel today that quiet prayer is fundamental for balance and proper perspective.

Reality intrudes very quickly and as He encounters the "vast" crowd, Jesus' heart is moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd. Jesus fulfills Jeremiah's vision, gathering the orphaned sheep into safe pastures. He formed a diverse flock into a community in His name. As Jeremiah prophesies and proclaims the words from God, "I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow. There they shall increase and multiply." This prophecy is fulfilled in Jesus.

We should also pray today for more shepherds to go forth with the flock. Just as Jesus sent his original Twelve out, the need is present today for more shepherds to nourish and strengthen his people.

At the end of each Mass we are sent out with an instruction such as "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." We are sent out and we return to the Lord each Sunday. On this journey we come to Jesus as he teaches and nourishes us as only a good shepherd can.

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
