CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is July 8, 2025 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least **6 months** in advance.

Pastor's Page

Our Gospel today focuses on a second mission of seventy-two disciples. Only Luke contains this story. It is probably meant to focus on the missionary mission of the Church after the departure of Jesus. We have to remember that as faith stories rather than simply a travelogue or chronological history, the Gospels are written from a post-resurrection point of view.

According to rabbinic teaching, there were seventy-two nations in the world, based on the reading of Genesis 10 in the Greek Septuagint. The disciples are to go ahead of him, not announcing themselves or their own message, but preparing the way for Jesus. The missionaries are sent in twos in order to give a witness that can be considered formal.

The disciples will be lambs among wolves, defenseless, completely dependent on the Lord of the harvest for whatever is needed. Several of the admonitions to these disciples repeat the instructions to the Twelve previously (Lk 9:1-5). The disciples are bringing Jesus and the Father to those whom they were sent.

The seventy-two are sent in their mission totally dependent upon God and mutually dependent on others, carrying only their experience of Jesus and the power to heal. Their boast is God, and the only begotten Son, Jesus Christ.

Jesus says in the Gospel that the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few. Our Church today is in need of more laborers as well. Not only in the ordained ministry but in all aspects of Church life and mission.

Every Mass begins and ends with the sign of the cross. It is the most prominent sign of our identity as Christians. St. Paul boasts in it, for it has transformed us all. In the Epistle today, the foundation of Paul's theology is the Cross of Christ, which represents the whole of Christ's death, burial and resurrection. (1Cor 15: 3-4) As Paul concludes his letter to the Galatians, he counters his rivals claims that he is boasting of himself. Rather, it is Christ's cross that is the subject of his boast. He suffers fully for the Gospel message. The cross is our reminder that we also should expect to suffer. However we should never forget that it is also a reminder of our redemption. **THE CROSS IS A SOURCE OF STRENGTH NOT OF SHAME AND DEFEAT.**

The Mission is difficult and potentially dangerous. Jesus recognizes the burden the cross will bring. No retaliation. Move on if not welcomed. Tremendous deeds will be performed in his name. The forces of sins will be overcome.

Remembering the message from the last couple Sundays, we are called to bring the good news that accompanies the taking of that cross to all we meet.

Let us focus on the theme of mission this weekend. As we celebrate our liturgy today, may our prayer be to know what instructions our Lord has for us on our mission to spread the Good News in our world today. May the nourishment we receive in the Eucharist today lead us to share Christ's presence in our travels, near and far.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL SCHOOL AND

All volunteers of our IHM School and Church must meet all Safe Environment requirements mandated by the State of Pennsylvania and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This includes all school volunteers and parish volunteers i.e. Lectors, EM, Choir Members, etc.

Please note: All clearances are free for volunteers. The State of PA requires that these be updated every 5 years. The requirements of the Archdiocese only needs to be completed once.
