#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

**Baptism** - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

**Pre-Jordan** - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is July 8, 2025 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

**Marriage** - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

**RCIA** - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

#### Pastor's Page

Today we come together to celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This is also known in Latin as "Corpus Christi". When we come together to celebrate Holy Mass, we can look at this sacred mystery from many different angles, with our focus ultimately directed on Jesus himself. As Jesus himself tells us, "I am the bread of life".

The celebration of Eucharist is central to who we are as Christians. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1324-1327), states that, "The Eucharist is "the source and summit" of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it.

Todays readings recount three different sacred meals: the sacrifice offered by Melchizedek, St. Paul's description of the Last Supper and Luke's account of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. As we hear these stories come alive today, let us recall God's many gifts to us, most especially the gift of the Eucharist.

In the second reading, Paul records the earliest written example of the liturgy of the Lord's supper. After admonishing the Corinthians for their poor behavior at the celebration of the Lord's Supper, he then recites the tradition he had received. Paul's account is most similar to that found in the Gospel of Luke. In both Paul and Luke, Jesus gives thanks, acknowledges that his body will be broken for their sake and says "do this in remembrance of me".

We should take particular note of the importance of blessing or thanking God. We need an attitude of gratitude for God's providence. Like Jesus we must take what we have, give God thanks, and share our very selves with others in the name of Jesus. We offer God what we have, like Abram, like the Apostles and Jesus. We should reflect on all the gifts that God has given us and bring them to the altar along with the bread and wine as we make ourselves united with Jesus.

We take Jesus at his Word: "This is my body....This is my blood." In this action and by his Word we believe that Jesus is truly present in those elements of bread and wine, that are substantially changed at the words of consecration.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines this doctrine in section 1376:

"The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: 'Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."

We give thanks for this wonderful gift of Jesus who gives us himself to nourish us on our journey and deliver us for life everlasting.



#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL SCHOOL AND

#### CHURCH VOLUNTEERS

All volunteers of our IHM School and Church must meet all Safe Environment requirements mandated by the State of Pennsylvania and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This includes all school volunteers and parish volunteers i.e. Lectors, EM, Choir Members, etc.

A list of all requirements are on the school website:iheartmary.org Go to Resources then to Volunteer and all the links are posted there. These clearances are FREE for volunteers

These requirements are MANDATORY and there will be no exceptions. These MUST be completed or you may not volunteer in our school for any trips, dances or in house activities or any parish ministries.

Please note: All clearances are free for volunteers. The State of PA requires that these be updated every 5 years. The requirements of the Archdiocese only needs to be completed once.
