CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, July 9 @ 7 PM in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pre-Cana Marriage Prep—Fall date to be announced.

<u>RCIA</u> - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

This week we celebrate a Solemnity that is celebrated on June 24 each year, no matter the day of the week: The Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. It takes precedence of the normal Sunday of the 12th Week in Ordinary time.

Before he was born, John was chosen by God to prepare the world for the Son of God.

We find much information about John the Baptist in Luke's Gospel. Luke begins his story of Jesus and the Christian people with the introduction of the parents of John the Baptist. We should notice the very Jewish beginning of this Gospel for the Greek believers. Zechariah and Elizabeth come out of the heart of Judaism. They are both of a priestly tribe, blameless in their observance of the Mosaic Law. Further, Luke also relates them to the ancient Hebrew parents Abraham and Sarah, who were also advanced in years and childless, but are able to believe in a divine surprise.

The scene is set in the temple in Jerusalem, where the hopes of the people of God were always centered. The angel allays Zechariah's fear and announces the promise "Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a Son" Zechariah is stunned. He is rendered speechless.

By the time Zechariah returns home, there is an aura of expectancy among the people. Dramatic events of salvation are now underway. The conception of John takes place as foretold, unknown to the world at large. At this point, it is still only an elderly Jewish couple who know that God has begun another important intervention, the most important intervention in the history of humanity.

In verses 57-80 of the first chapter of Luke we see Zechariah regain his power of speech as soon as the name designated by the angel is confirmed. The people are filled with fear, not terror, but awesome reverence in the face of God's wondrous deeds.


Zechariah's canticle is called "The Benedictus", which like the Magnificat of Mary weaves traditional Hebrew quotations and themes into a hymn of praise. Zechariah sees in the birth of his son, God's remembrance of his covenant promises to David and the definitive salvation for all people.

Luke's way of ending this story of John's birth is a good indication of his technique in keeping the reader's attention on one episode at a time. I would recommend reading on your own the complete first chapter of Luke. Verse 80 has John growing up from infancy to manhood and taking his place in the desert even before Jesus' birth is described. He is stationed there for his next appearance in the story thirty years later. See Chapter 3 of Luke.

John the Baptist was called to prepare the people for the coming of the Lord. We will also hear today from Jeremiah (at the Vigil Mass) or Isaiah (at Sunday mass). These two prophets were also called by the Lord before they were born. By our Baptism, each of us also shares in Christ's prophetic and salvific mission. As we listen to the readings today, let us reflect on the mission of Preparing the Way of the Lord.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
