CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is July 8, 2025 at 7 pm in the Chapel. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least **6 months** in advance.

Pastor's Page

Who was the most influential in the spread of the Christian faith? Today we celebrate two saints—Peter and Paul—whose paths were different and whose relationship was not without tension.

Peter was the first pope, called personally by Jesus. Though hesitant at first, this fisherman left his nets to follow a virtual stranger.

Peter was bold, often the first to speak when others stayed silent. Sometimes his boldness led to moments of grace, other times to rebuke—like when he tried to convince Jesus that suffering and the cross were not necessary.

Yet, relying on mercy and grace, Peter responded to the Lord's invitation after the Resurrection: "Peter, do you love me? Feed my sheep." And he did, even to the point of giving his life.

Paul, on the other hand, took a very different road—both literally and spiritually. A Pharisee by training, he began as a fierce persecutor of Christians, complicit in the death of St. Stephen. But everything changed on the road to Damascus. There, Jesus stopped him in his tracks and turned his life around.

From that moment on, Paul became one of the Church's most tireless missionaries. His letters and journeys carried the Gospel far beyond Jerusalem, helping to spread the faith throughout the Roman Empire.

There was real tension between these two apostles, rooted in a foundational question: did a person need to become Jewish before they could become Christian? It may seem obvious to us now, but at the time, it was not. Together, they helped the early Church navigate this struggle, agreeing to let go of certain external customs while remaining faithful to the heart of the covenant.

Their unity—despite differences—remains a model for us.

So, back to the question: who was the most influential in spreading the faith? In the end, the answer is Jesus. And if that feels like a bit of a cheat, then we might say Mary. From the cross, Jesus entrusted Mary to the Church as Mother. And so we turn to her in our time here on earth.

Mary, help us. Help us listen well to the Holy Spirit, that we might become more fully the Body of Christ for the life of the world.

As we approach Independence Day on Friday, July 4, please keep our nation in your prayers.

On July 3rd the Parish Office will close at 12:30 and will be closed on July 4th in observance of the Independence Day Holiday.


Each Tuesday the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for our adoration in our Sacred Heart Chapel from 9 am to 6:30 pm.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL SCHOOL AND

CHURCH VOLUNTEERS

All volunteers of our IHM School and Church must meet all Safe Environment requirements mandated by the State of Pennsylvania and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This includes all school volunteers and parish volunteers i.e. Lectors, EM, Choir Members, etc.

A list of all requirements are on the school website:iheartmary.org Go to Resources then to Volunteer and all the links are posted there. These clearances are FREE for volunteers

These requirements are MANDATORY and there will be no exceptions. These MUST be completed or you may not volunteer in our school for any trips, dances or in house activities or any parish ministries.

Please note: All clearances are free for volunteers. The State of PA requires that these be updated every 5 years. The requirements of the Archdiocese only needs to be completed once.
