#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is to be announced. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

### Pastor's Page

In our first reading from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Chapter of Genesis, the purpose of the interrogation of the man and the woman is to bring them to an admission of their sin. It is interesting to note that the all too human response of the man is to blame the woman and also indirectly God. "This woman YOU put here"...The woman in turn blames the serpent. The punishments that follow are expressed in poetic form. God's care of humanity does not cease because of sin, but continues in spite of sin. On God's initiative the relationship disrupted by sin will be restored.

Most of the Gospel readings during the B cycle of readings are taken from the Gospel of Mark. Mark was the first of the gospels written chronologically, written sometime between 65 and 70 AD. Mark wrote his gospel as a dramatic story with Jesus at the center. The Gospel is written at a quick pace, with Jesus always moving, inviting His disciples and us to follow. Mark wanted those who heard or read his Gospel to come to understand Jesus and recognize Him as the Son of God.

The main idea in today's gospel is the ongoing battle between good and evil. Jesus expels demons and indicates that the final defeat of evil, promised in the world to come, has now been initiated in history, in the person of Jesus himself. The scribes accused Jesus of being possessed by Satan because he healed people and drove out demons on the Sabbath. Mark, writing to convince people that Jesus was the Son of God, has Jesus show them how ridiculous their conclusion is, "How can Satan drive out Satan'? He reveals the Holy Spirit as the true power behind his work. The "clean" spirit drives out the unclean spirits.

When we act in accord with the Spirit, we show our kinship with Jesus, "for whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." Jesus expects His followers to have the same single-minded dedication to God's will as He does. Such dedication may lead to conflict with people like the Jerusalem scribes. It may seem crazy or overdone to others, even to members of one's own family.

Jesus' response to the accusation that He is possessed by the devil is brief and pointed. In two parables about divided kingdoms and divided houses, He shows how self-defeating it would be if He, who drives evil spirits out of people were an agent of Satan. Jesus also points out that the only unforgivable sin belongs to his accusers, who refuse to accept the power of God's Holy Spirit at work in him. Jesus is possessed by God's Spirit, and so are all those who chose to do God's will.

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
