#### **CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS**

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Tuesday, March 14 @ 7 pm in the Church. Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

#### Pastor's Page

Today on the Third Sunday of Lent, the Church celebrates the first of three scrutinies with the Elect and their communities throughout the Church. The scriptures today are chosen explicitly to help the Elect as they undergo their final preparations for the Easter Sacraments. We the baptized too can scrutinize our own lives today, following the example of the Elect in allowing Our Lord to uncover and heal all that is weak and sinful in the way we live.

The readings today speak of the importance of water. Water is an essential element of life. Without it we die. The biblical personages in both the old and the new testament lived in a land surrounded by barren deserts.

In the first reading from Exodus, the people are facing a challenge in finding water now that they have left Egypt. They have briefly celebrated their newfound freedom from Pharaoh and the Egyptians when they begin to complain about the hardships of the journey. They are bitterly complaining against God and Moses. Eventually they are going to have to learn over and over to keep trusting in God's care for them. This is going to be a long drawn out process.

They even question whether they should have stayed in Egypt. Amazing how revisionist history can color our perspective. "Why did you ever make us leave Egypt? Was it to make us die here of thirst with our children and our live-stock?" Their lack of faith even moves them to cry out and ask, "Is the Lord in our midst or not'?

Rocks are not known for their water content. But in another of the miracles the Lord works through Moses, he instructs him to strike a rock with his staff, the same staff that he used in parting the Red Sea. The water struck from the rock is to quench the people's thirst, it becomes a strong symbol for life. "Come let us acclaim the Rock of our salvation. Let us come into his presence with Thanksgiving.

The Gospel reading from John chapter 4 today, also speaks of the symbol of water, used to describe God's life giving presence. Jesus himself becomes the living water to the Samaritan woman. Recall that the Jewish relationship with the Samaritans, who were located between Galilee on the north and Judea to the south was very bad and historically conditioned. The problems dated back to the 700sBC, when foreigners came into this area after the Assyrian exile. The foreigners who came into the territory partially adopted Israel's religion but were always viewed by the Jews as hated, semi-pagan invaders. It would have been very surprising that Jesus even spoke to this woman.


The story includes a lengthy dialogue with the woman. Jesus meets the woman at the well where Jacob met Rachel. To start off with, this Samaritan woman was considered outside the law, by faith and by lifestyle. Jesus guides her from perceiving him as simply another man to the point where she says, "I can see you are a prophet." Eventually the dialogue leads to her, of all people, becoming an evangelizer, hastening to her follow townspeople. She becomes a conduit of faith's living water. Remember water seeks it own level.

As Moses struck the rock with his staff, may Jesus cross – the abiding instrument of God's unconditional mercy –strike our hardened hearts, unsealing God's merciful love to flow into our lives.

#### SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
