CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>**Pre-Jordan</u></u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.</u>

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

In our Year C cycle of the scripture readings for Mass, on the second Sunday of Lent, we read Luke's account of the Transfiguration (Luke 9:28b-36) Each of the synoptic gospels, Mark, Matthew and Luke has a description of the Transfiguration it is such an important event. The placement of the Transfiguration story this early in Lent is from an ancient tradition that says Jesus Transfiguration took place 40 days before Good Friday.

The Transfiguration is a dazzling contrast to the message of suffering and humiliation. The two extremes are held together in the gospels as Jesus is presented as he is – Son of Man and Son of God. Several of the details in the story recall the Sinai experience of God in the Old Testament: Moses, the mountain top and the cloud. Jesus is seen as God's son in his heavenly glory. He is "changed in appearance" as he will be in his glorified body.

Appearing with Jesus are two key Old Testament figures: Moses the lawgiver and Elijah the prophet. Their presence here indicates that Jesus will fulfill the expectations of the Hebrew people, as Jesus indicates elsewhere, he is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets.

Todays Gospel gives us a glimpse of the Resurrection. Jesus is transformed while at prayer. God visits him through Moses and Elijah in a cloud, with a voice, "this is my chosen son: listen to him" The event takes place fairly late in Jesus public ministry in Galilee. The road now leads to Jerusalem.

As we reflect on the Transfiguration Gospel story today, we need to remember that Jesus is now about to suffer and die in order to release God's transforming power to humanity. We look at the meaning of Jesus suffering. Transcendence comes only through death and resurrection. We need to accept the cost of discipleship. By our journey along with Jesus up to Jerusalem we are called to share in the Paschal mystery – the dying and rising of Jesus.

Reminder: during Lent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available on Wednesday evenings in the Church from 6:15 pm to 7:15 pm. This is in addition to the regular schedule of 4:00 pm to 5:00 pm on Saturdays. Please try to take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Lenten season and in preparation of the Easter Triduum. The Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and extends through Easter Sunday. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will not be celebrated on Good Friday or Holy Saturday. Good Friday is the one day in the entire year that no Masses are offered anywhere in the world. Instead we focus our attention on the remembrance of Christ's suffering and death on the cross. The main liturgy on Good Friday is the Celebration of the Lord's Passion. While not a Mass, this liturgy includes the Liturgy of the Word, adoration of the Cross and a communion service with hosts that were consecrated at the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper. From the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion at 3 PM there are no more liturgical celebrations until the Easter Vigil at 8 PM.

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
