CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is May 7 at 7 pm in the Chapel.

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for **each** child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

Pastor's Page

As we move deeper into Lent, our scripture readings take a more ominous tone. Starting with the 12th Chapter in John's gospel, we see more references to the upcoming passion. This passage in today's gospel is the key to all of chapter 12. We also see that the mission is opening up, with the introduction of "some Greeks'. This is a hint about the university of the Jesus mission.

The hour has come in which Jesus will be glorified in which God will manifest to the utmost, his presence in his Son. This hour entails death; the grain of wheat must fall to the ground if it is to produce fruit. When you think about it, it is amazing that a tiny seed of wheat, planted in fertile soil and given plenty of sun and rain, can grow into a plant that is thousands of times the size of the original seed. However, this can only happen if the seed dies, opening and spilling out all of its life force within.

In verse 22, Jesus proclaims, "And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself". The beginning of this being lifted up will be His crucifixion.

What Jesus is insisting upon in this episode, is that life will be offered to the world *through* death. If he is buried like the seed, if he is lifted onto the cross, then much fruit will come. He will then draw all things to himself. In a remarkable way, this being buried, being raised on the cross is also Jesus' glorification, the manifestation in him of His Father's presence, and this is nowhere more evident than in Jesus' act of self-sacrificing love. As Jesus mentions his own self giving, he joins it to that of his disciples. We are called to identical servant roles.

As Lent moves into its final days, have our Lenten practices brought us closer to Jesus in his journey up to Jerusalem? We still have time to recollect ourselves and focus on our communion with Jesus. That is of course what we do each time we join him at the altar. We unite ourselves to him. When we say Amen, we seal the deal. This is the new Covenant that Jeremiah is talking about in today's Old Testament reading. Jeremiah tells us that in this New Covenant God's law will be so written on our hearts, it will be very evident. With a new heart, we will have knowledge and be open to obedience in seeking God's will.

Our opening prayer invites us to "walk eagerly in that same charity" out of which Jesus gave his life for us.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
