CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBA.** Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

Pastor's Page

The fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally known as "Laetare Sunday". We have pretty much reached the half way point of our Lenten journey. The Latin word "Laetare" means rejoice. We rejoice in the knowledge that the cross does not end in death, that Jesus story does not end at the tomb. In the Gospel today, we are going to hear the story from the gospel of John as Jesus brings light to the darkness of a blind man's world. He can do the same for us. In fact He has already done this for us.

In the baptismal liturgy we receive a share of the light of Christ. The Paschal candle is always displayed prominently near the baptismal font during most of the year. During Easter season, it is placed near the Ambo where the Word is proclaimed. In a funeral mass, it is placed near the casket. In the baptismal liturgy, after the pouring of the water and the anointing with the Sacred Chrism, the priests lights the individual candle and gives it the newly baptized or to the parents and godparents and says, "Receive the Light of Christ! This light is given to you to be kept burning brightly. You are to walk always as a child of the light."

In the second reading today from the Letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians, he speaks of the importance of that light of Christ. "You were once in darkness but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light..." Remember both Isaiah (9:2) and Matthew (4) talk about this. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom, a light has shone." The source of this light is unmistakable: in John's Gospel Jesus says very clearly, "I am the light of the world."

The Healing of the Blind man is one of four miracles stories that are found only in the Gospel of John. John includes just seven miracles in his Gospel, far fewer than in the Synoptic Gospels. However in John's gospel he describes those seven miracles in much greater detail than the synoptic gospels describe theirs. For example John often follows the story of the miracles with a lengthy discussion about its deeper meaning among those who witnessed it. The synoptic accounts focus on the miracles themselves, whereas John's accounts focus on the symbolic meaning of the miracles.

In first century Palestine, sickness and suffering were regarded by the Jews as punishment from God. At times we fall into that trap. "why is God doing this to me"? Jesus does not agree with this point of view. Ultimately human suffering remains a mystery. It is very ironic in the story that the religious leaders who can physically see, wind up expelling the once blind man out of the temple. The spiritually blind end up safely inside the temple, but locked out of the light-filled knowledge of Jesus as Lord. We need to walk as children of the light as St. Paul urges us.

Jesus is the light of the world. He gave sight to the blind, but more than that, he gives light to our minds and hearts – light that guides us toward eternal life.

Grateful for the gift of light that has been entrusted to us at Baptism, let us continue to nurture that light with the oxygen of grace as we offer our prayer of thanksgiving this weekend.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
