Pastor's Page

Lent is just around the corner. In fact it is three days away. It is a good time to think about our character as we approach this holy season. A good way to define character is that it is the sum of our virtues and vices. As committed Christians we want to conform our lives to Christ. Unlike Christ, who was perfect in every way, as was his Father in heaven, we are sinners. We want to maximize our virtues while limiting and overcoming our vices.

These last few days before Lent are a good time to think about our character. For example: Am I prone to judging others? Am I more likely to recognize other's faults, rather than my own? Jesus points out today that when we overlook our own faults, not only are we ourselves left deficient, but our judgmental outlook distorts our view of others.

Over the last several weeks we have heard Jesus begin to teach his disciples and us, how to see the world through God's eyes. Two weeks ago we heard Jesus tell us that the poor and hungry would be rewarded and that woe would come to those who are rich and satisfied, especially if we did not share what we had.

Last week Jesus told us to love our enemies and turn the other cheek. Today he tells us to remove the wooden beam from our own judging eyes. This is a challenge, for it contradicts how most people view the world. It matches however how God has acted through human history. Repeatedly God has shown mercy to the sinner, blessed the needy and forgiven the enemy. Jesus calls us to do the same.

Wisdom literature in the scriptures is full of short, pithy statements of truth. The reading from Sirach is typical of that today. Jesus shares some of his own wisdom statements in the Gospel passage. Luke and Sirach each point out the importance of integrity and the danger of hypocrisy. What we say and what we do must be sincere. Otherwise our words are those of a hypocrite. People will ignore what we say if our words our empty. The importance of frequent examination of conscience and the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a great remedy. Jesus gives us this challenge today: "When fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher."

Let us seize the opportunity to listen to these wise words today. Jesus reminds us: "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit." Obviously none of us want to bear rotten fruit, but do we realize that avoiding doing so is not enough? How many of us are actually bearing no fruit at all? Have we produced something good and valuable over the last week or the last month that we have generously given to someone else? Let us do more than just avoid bearing rotten fruit. May we produce fruit that causes our family, friends, coworkers, classmates, and strangers to appreciate what we generously provide.



<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
