CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

<u>Pre-Jordan</u> - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is TBD.

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

<u>Marriage</u> - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

The Sanctuary Light in our Sacred Heart Chapel for the week of March 21 to March 27 is in loving memory of Joseph Gavula requested by Joe Gavula. A very important passage from the Book of Exodus is our Old Testament reading today for the 3rd Sunday of Lent. Exodus is always a good book to read during the season of Lent.

Life has gone on in a miserable way for the Israelites. They had become slaves over the several hundred years since the death of Joseph. The knowledge of the one God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and Joseph has pretty much disappeared. As they cry out, God however is mindful of their suffering and of the promise to Abraham.

One day while tending sheep in Midian, Moses sees a strange sight – a bush is aflame but not consumed. Drawing near, he hears the voice of God telling him to remove his sandals, for he is standing on holy ground. Moses is awed by this mysterious presence, then alarmed to hear the command that he return to Egypt and order the Pharaoh to let the Israelites go. Moses protests that he is unsuited for such a task, but God insists. Again Moses protests. He says he does not even know God's name.

Now we see Revelation in action. God reveals the sacred name to be '*Yahweh*', interpreted within the sacred text as "I am who I am". This may better be expressed as "I am the One who is always present' It is basically the verb to be "I am" He is existence itself. For Jews the name Yahweh stressed the unutterable mystery of God and out of reverence they have preferred not to pronounce it. Instead they substitute titles such as Adonai, meaning the Lord.

This story begins the prophetic ministry of Moses, who armed with God's promises will lead the people from slavery into "a land flowing with milk and honey", fulfilling the promise made to Abraham several hundred years before.

In the passage from Luke's gospel we hear today, Jesus continues his call for decision and reform by referring to contemporary disasters and telling a parable. Pilate was well known for his harsh rule and his insensitivity to Jewish religious feelings. The first of these otherwise unknown incidents refers to the killing of some Galileans while they were offering sacrifice in the Temple at Passover. The second example involves what was probably a construction accident at the Siloam reservoir at Jerusalem. Popular wisdom and belief at that time associated disaster with punishment for sin. Jesus says that in the present age good fortune and disaster are no indication of a person's spiritual state. However, in the final judgment those who have been evil will be called to account. Now is the time to produce evidence of a life dedicated to the Kingdom. Ultimately the judgment day will come

The sharpness of Jesus warning is softened a bit by the parable of the unproductive fig tree. Only at the insistence and compassion of the gardener did the owner relent. "I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future". (Lk 13:8-9) The parable about the fig tree is another statement about God's desire to save us. Through Jesus, God cultivates us and fertilizes us with his mercy!

<u>SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/</u> <u>CONFIRMATION</u>

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
