CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism - The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 PM.

Pre-Jordan - Instruction/sacramental preparation for parents of children to be baptized is held every other month. The meeting is usually held in the Sacred Heart Chapel, except during Lent, when it is held in Church. Parents of children to be baptized should contact Mrs. Denise Schmidt in the parish office between the hours of 9am and 4pm to register. **The next date for the Parent Pre-Jordan is Monday, May 9, 2022 at 7 pm in the Chapel.**

Pre-Jordan sacramental preparation is required for each child to be baptized at IHM. Please see the guidelines for choosing a sponsor on page 6 of the Parish Bulletin.

Marriage - To adequately prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, Archdiocesan policy requires that couples contact one of the priests of the parish at least 6 months in advance.

IHM offers a one day **Pre-Cana** Seminar that assists couples in preparation for their upcoming marriage. The Pre-Cana is conducted twice a year (Spring and Fall). **There is no Pre-Cana Seminar planned at this time.** Please call Denise Schmidt, parish secretary at 215-483-1000 for further information.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the program for those interested in initiation into the Catholic Faith. Information is also available for those who may not have completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation).

Pastor's Page

The Entrance Antiphon today begins with the word, "Rejoice", *Laetare* in Latin. That is why we traditionally have called the Fourth Sunday of Lent, *Laetare Sunday*. We rejoice not merely because we are more than half way through Lent. We rejoice because we know God is always eager to reconcile with us. Today's readings celebrate this fact. The Israelites have finally made it to the Promised Land. In the second reading from 2 Corinthians, Saint Paul points out that God has sent Jesus to reconcile us to the Father, redeeming his creation.

The Gospel from Luke today gives maybe the best example of this reconciliation in a very practical way. This 15th Chapter of Luke's gospel is bound together by the theme of joy over the recovery of what was lost. All three parables apply the return of the repentant sinner. The story today of the Prodigal Son develops the theme of God's love and adds the contrast of the older brother's hostility. Jesus himself is surrounded by "tax collectors and sinners" causing murmuring among the scribes and Pharisees.

Jesus is certainly the master teacher. This parable is probably the most famous of all his parables. Through this story Jesus illustrates the earth shattering acceptance available in the Kingdom of God. The traditional title of "Prodigal Son" is very well known, but it is really the father that is the pivotal character in the story and how he loves both his sons.

In traditional Jewish law, the first born son received a double share of the inheritance. (Deuteronomy 21:17) The younger son in this case was entitled to a third of the estate. Normally this was divided up on the death of the Father, but there were penalties if the share was withdrawn ahead of time. By demanding his share and leaving, the younger son is leaving, cutting ties with no regrets. He takes everything with him and there is no reasonable hope that he will be back. This hurts the remaining family in the short term.

Later as Jesus tells us disaster awaits the younger son. For the Hebrew, caring for Pigs is as low as you can go, it evoked the idea of apostasy, they were unclean animals. When he comes to his senses and comes home, his father rushes out to meet him and hugs and kisses him and welcomes back to his household, unconditionally!

The twist that Jesus puts on the story is the hostility of the older son. The older son's anger and self-righteousness make him very resentful. The pivot of the story is the Father's movement toward the older son. We can see the father as God and put ourselves into the story. Am I like the Father? Or like the elder or the younger son? Or maybe we have parts of all three in me at various times.

The Pharisees and scribes are upset that the God Jesus shows is generous in mercy. Jesus welcomes those they judge and exclude. The story here is not the return of the younger son, it is not the return of the younger son that irks the older son. It is the father's compassion, generosity, and celebration that anger the older son. The father reconciles with the younger son immediately. No questions asked. This parable is witness to the hope of reconciliation, the lost are found and the dead brought back to life.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
